Kerajaan perang ketirisan, penyeludupan tenaga

PETALING JAYA: Kerajaan mematahkan cubaan menyeludup bekalan tenaga dengan rampasan bernilai RM2,189,121 bagi menjamin bekalan negara ketika dunia menghadapi krisis tenaga.

Ia menerusi pelaksanaan Op Tiris 4.0 (Bersepadu) Jawatankuasa Tertinggi Penyelidikan Antara Agensi Penguatkuasaan Bagi Membanteras Ketirisan dan Penyeludupan (JTPAP) yang dilakukan dari 16 Mac hingga semalam.

Dalam tempoh tersebut, sebanyak 8,148 pemeriksaan dilakukan dan menghasilkan sebanyak 155 kes.

Timbalan Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof berkata, sebanyak 60 kes melibatkan diesel dengan nilai rampasan lebih RM2.1 juta dan 47 kes pula melibatkan petrol RON95 (RM51,299).

Beliau berkata, 21 kes melibatkan gas petroleum cecair (LPG) dengan rampasan bernilai RM51,299 dan 27 kes melibatkan minyak masak, gula serta tepung gandum.

"Hari ini juga, satu mesyuarat susulan JTPAP telah diadakan. Antara keputusan utama mesyuarat yang telah dipersejuti termasuk menetapkan agensi peneraju utama bagi tiga sektor yang telah dikenal pasti

meliputi sektor darat yang akan diterajui oleh Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN).

"Sektor sempadan akan diterajui oleh Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) dan sektor perairan diterajui oleh Agensi Penguatkuasaan Maritim Malaysia (APMM) agensi di bawah Kementerian Dalam Negeri (KDN)," katanya dalam Taklimat Krisis Tenaga Global, semalam.

JTPAP dianggotai oleh KPDN selaku urus setia, KDN, Kementerian Pertahanan, Kementerian Pengangkutan (MOT), Kementerian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan (KPKM) serta kerajaan Sabah dan Sarawak termasuk agensi-agensi penguatkuasaan berkaitan.

Pengaktifan jawatankuasa tertinggi itu adalah untuk

memperkasa penguatkuasaan dan pemantauan ketirisan barang kawalan susulan krisis tenaga global akibat konflik Asia Barat yang meningkatkan risiko penyelewengan dan penyeludupan barang kawalan khususnya bahan api diesel dan petrol.

Fadillah berkata, JTPAP akan mengambil tindakan tegas termasuk menggantung dan membatalkan kelulusan fleet card di bawah Skim Kawalan Diesel Bersubsidi (SKDS) dan subsidi diesel nelayan sekiranya berlaku penyalahgunaan.

Selain itu, katanya, mempertingkat dan memperkukuh kawal selia ke atas aktiviti bunkering dan mewujudkan pasukan khas bagi Sabah dan Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan

serta Sarawak yang masing-masing akan dipengerusikan secara bersama oleh Setiausaha Persekutuan dan Setiausaha Kerajaan Negeri.

"KPDN Negeri akan menjadi sekretariat kepada kedua-dua pasukan khas ini. Pasukan khas ini akan turut melibatkan agensi agensi di peringkat negeri yang berkenaan.

"Pasukan khas ini akan turut melibatkan agensi agensi di peringkat negeri yang berkenaan dan memperluaskan pelaksanaan SKDS melalui penggunaan fleet card untuk Sektor Pengangkutan Darat Barangan di Sabah, Sarawak dan Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan," katanya.

Menteri Peralihan Tenaga dan Transformasi Air itu berkata, beberapa syor strategik hasil daripada mesyuarat JTPAP juga akan dikemukakan kepada Majlis Tindakan Ekonomi Negara (MTEN) secara berkala sebagai langkah tambahan memastikan kestabilan bekalan negara.

"Antara ketetapan utama termasuk pelantikan agensi peneraju mengikut sektor iaitu KPDN (Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup) bagi sektor darat, Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) di bawah KDN (Kementerian Dalam Negeri) untuk kawasan sempadan, manakala Maritim Malaysia (APMM) bagi sektor perairan.

Selain itu, pelaksanaan SKDS akan diperluaskan melalui penggunaan kad khas bagi

sektor pengangkutan barangan di Sabah, Sarawak dan Labuan.

Swift action on subsidy misuse

Intensified operation leads to RM2mil diesel seizure

PETALING JAYA: Anyone abusing diesel subsidies under the Subsidised Diesel Control Scheme will find themselves facing swift and firm legal action, including the suspension and revocation of fleet card approvals.

Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof said the decision was agreed upon at a meeting of the High-Level Inter-Agency Coordination Committee on Combating Leakage and Smuggling (JTPAP), which he chaired at the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry in Putrajaya yesterday.

He said the measure is aimed at ensuring the sustainability and stability of the nation's energy supply.

"The global energy crisis resulting from the West Asian conflict has increased the risk of misappropriation and smuggling of controlled goods, particularly diesel and petrol," he said during a

briefing on the global energy crisis yesterday.

Fleet cards under the Subsidised Diesel Control Scheme (SKDS) will be expanded to Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan as part of tighter enforcement measures to curb leakages and smuggling of fuel.

Fadillah, who is also the Energy Transition and Water Transformation Minister, said the expansion for land freight transport in the two states and Federal Territory were among key measures agreed upon by the committee.

"The government will expand the SKDS using fleet cards for the land transport sector in Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan," he said.

The move comes amid intensified enforcement under Op Tiris 4.0 (Integrated), which began on March 16.

Fadillah said authorities conducted 8,148 inspections between

March 16 and April 5, resulting in 155 cases involving controlled goods.

Of these, 60 cases involved diesel, with seizures valued at RM2,189,121.

"Another 47 cases were linked to RON95 petrol, with seizures worth RM51,299, while 21 cases involved liquefied petroleum gas, amounting to RM37,822," he said.

Fadillah added that 27 cases involved other controlled goods, including cooking oil, sugar and wheat flour.

According to the Deputy Prime Minister, the government wants to ensure supply stability as well as proper distribution.

"The government's main focus is not only to ensure supply stability but also to take immediate steps to tighten control and monitoring of distribution," he said.

"The authorities will also increase and strengthen monitoring over bunkering activities," he added.

He said that the integrated Op Tiris 4.0 enforcement involves close coordination among multiple agencies to ensure stricter monitoring, particularly amid global uncertainties affecting fuel supplies.

Fadillah also announced that integrated Op Tiris 4.0 task forces under JTPAP will be formed in Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan.

The task forces will jointly be chaired by the Federal Secretary and the respective State Secretaries.

The state-level Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry will serve as secretariat, with relevant state agencies also involved.

Fadillah said several strategic

recommendations from the meeting would also be submitted to the National Economic Action Council to ensure the continued stability of the country's energy supply amid geopolitical tensions.

"The government will not let the people be affected by supply disruptions.

"We have strengthened our preparedness through strategic and integrated measures to ensure that the security of supply in the local market remains under control," he said.

On Sunday, Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the monthly allocation for the SKDS rose to an estimated RM2.2bil in March – nearly three times higher than the previously reported RM700mil – due to escalating global diesel prices.

Diesel smuggling risk rises

PUTRAJAYA: Smuggling, misappropriation and hoarding of diesel are expected to increase following the West Asian conflict that has triggered the global energy crisis.

This requires stricter and more integrated enforcement actions, said Minister of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN), Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali (pic).

He said this was what has prompted contingency plans to ensure continued energy supply security to meet domestic needs, although the country's petroleum supply remains stable.

He said the Government is not only focusing on supply stability but tightening control and monitoring of controlled goods distribution to curb leakages.



It has strengthened existing operations by upgrading Ops Tiris 3.0 to Ops Tiris 4.0 (Integrated), which came into effect on March 16.

The new approach emphasises cross-agency collaboration among various enforcement bodies and relevant ministries to enhance monitoring effectiveness and on-the-ground action.

"This enforcement operation involves three main clusters, namely land, maritime and border, with comprehensive coordination among agencies to ensure there is no room for leakage activities.

"At the same time, the High-Level Inter-Agency Coordination Committee to Combat Leakages and Smuggling (JTIPAP) was also activated immediately on March 11 as a strategic measure.

"JTIPAP, chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof, will also chair its next meeting on April 6 to assess the status of enforcement implementation," he said.

Armizan said the Government has also

strengthened controls through daily monitoring using a database dashboard that covers the entire fuel distribution chain.

The monitoring includes all levels, from refineries and storage facilities to petrol stations and industrial users, to ensure transparency and detect any non-compliance more quickly.

The data-driven approach is crucial in addressing the various modus operandi used by irresponsible parties in leakage activities.

"Besides enforcement, KPDN is also strengthening the 'KITA GEMPUR' movement, a campaign to combat manipulation and leakages, which was launched on Oct. 19, 2024.

"This approach adopts a 'whole-of-nation' concept, involving comprehensive public participation in efforts to curb manipulation in business activities and leakages of controlled goods," he said.

Armizan stressed that public cooperation is crucial in channelling information related to misappropriation activities.

He said members of the public with information or complaints can submit them through KPDN's official channels, including WhatsApp, the e-Aduan portal, the call centre line and the Ez ADU KPDN application.

He advised the public to remain prudent and responsible when sharing information and to avoid spreading unverified news that could cause public concern.

"Strict action can be taken against any party that spreads false or inaccurate information in accordance with existing laws," he said.

It was reported that global oil prices have surged 25 per cent, with Brent crude recording its largest daily increase, further driving up shipping costs and increasing global economic pressure.

This shows that the energy crisis is no longer a localised issue but has become a global challenge with direct impacts on the daily lives of people in many countries.

Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Amar Fadillah Yusof said the decision was agreed upon at a meeting of the High-Level Inter-Agency Coordination Committee on Combating Leakage and Smuggling, which he chaired at the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) here yesterday.

He said the measure is aimed at ensuring the sustainability and stability of the nation's energy supply.

"The global energy crisis resulting from the West Asian conflict has increased the risk of misappropriation and smuggling of controlled goods, particularly diesel and petrol," he said during a briefing on the global energy crisis.

Meanwhile, Fadillah said the implementation of the SKDS through the use of fleet cards for the land freight transport sector will be expanded to Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan.

The Minister of Energy Transition and Water Transformation said the meeting also agreed to designate lead agencies for three identified sectors to curb leakage.

The land sector will be led by KPDN, the border sector by the Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM), while the maritime sector will be overseen by the Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency (MMEA), he said.

Meanwhile, to enhance and strengthen regulatory oversight over bunkering activities, the meeting agreed to establish a special task force, Ops Tiris 4.0

(Integrated), for Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan.

"It will be co-chaired by the Federal Secretary and the State Secretary, with the respective state KPDN serving as the secretariat for both task forces, which will also involve relevant agencies at the state level," he said.

rasi kira-kira jam 9.45 pagi itu, pasukan Strike Force Kompeni C, Batalion 9 PGA bersama Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) Pasir Mas mengesan sebuah lori dalam keadaan mencurigakan di Kampung Kubang Bemban.

Pemeriksaan lanjut mendapati lori tersebut telah diubah suai dengan tangki tambahan yang mengandungi kira-kira 320 liter minyak diesel.

"Siasatan awal mendapati suspek mengaku menghantar diesel ke pangkalan haram di Nibong untuk diseludup ke Thailand dengan bayaran RM60 bagi setiap trip," katanya dalam satu kenyataan pada Isnin.

KPDN foils diesel misappropriation in Penang and Lahad Datu

BUKIT MERTAJAM: The Penang office of the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) has dismantled a syndicate involved in the misappropriation of subsidised diesel, seizing fuel worth RM327,963.80 in a raid on an unauthorised storage facility in Sungai Lokan, Butterworth, on Saturday night.

Its director S. Jegan said that following a month of intelligence gathering, officers raided the facility at 8.30 pm and found diesel being transferred between two tanker lorries.

"During the raid, an 18,000-litre tanker was transferring diesel into a 23,000-litre tanker. Further inspection revealed that the premises failed to produce the necessary

documents, licences, or permits to possess and manage scheduled controlled goods.

"The syndicate's modus operandi involved using the 18,000-litre tanker as a mobile storage unit, collecting diesel from several smaller lorries that purchased fuel in limited quantities from petrol stations statewide," he told a press conference on Sunday.

KPDN seized the tanker lorries, equipment such as hoses and pumps, and business documents, along with 21,190 litres of diesel.

Jegan said the syndicate was believed to accumulate diesel gradually, with members purchasing fuel, particularly on Wednesdays, at petrol stations before price changes took

effect.

He added that the fuel was subsequently moved to other tankers and was believed to be transported out of Penang to be sold to industrial users at a lower cost than their usual market price.

He said two Myanmar men in their 20s, who were working at the illegal storage facility, were also detained during the raid.

Further investigations are ongoing to trace the syndicate's mastermind and its network, he said.

Meanwhile, in Lahad Datu, KPDN detained two men on Sunday and seized 1,000 litres of diesel along with two four-wheel-drive vehicles, with a total value estimated at RM117,150.

Lahad Datu KPDN Enforcement chief Azizul Amran said the arrests and seizures were carried out under Ops Tiris 4.0 at a petrol station in the district.

He said the operation began at midnight and involved four enforcement officers.

"During the inspection, enforcement officers found two local men in their 20s filling diesel into drums loaded onto two four-wheel-drive vehicles. Both suspects failed to produce any documents or permits authorising the diesel purchase," he said in a statement.

In Beaufort, no offences were detected during a joint inspection of several petrol stations by the ministry and the police. — Bernama

Illegal subsidised diesel seized in Sibu operations

SIBU: A total of 132,000 litres of illegally stored subsidised diesel, valued at RM283,800, was seized from a vessel during a joint enforcement operation by the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry and the police.

A 60-year-old local man, believed to be the vessel's caretaker, was also arrested for his alleged involvement in a subsidised diesel smuggling syndicate.

The raid, conducted under Ops Tiris 4.0 on April 3 at a jetty along Jalan Ulu Lanang, also led to the

seizure of a locally registered vessel suspected of being used to misappropriate subsidised fuel.

The total value of items confiscated, including the vessel, is estimated at RM773,600.

KPDN Sibu chief Roslee Masli said the operation followed intelligence gathering and close monitoring by enforcement authorities.

"Our team detained the vessel and found diesel stored in nine separate tanks, believed to have been kept without valid permission from the Supply Controller," he said at a press conference yesterday.

He added that the vessel failed to produce valid documentation related to the ownership and transportation of the fuel.

"A case has been opened under Ops 555 and Ops Jeriji pursuant to Section 21 of the Supply Control Act 1961 for possession or control of controlled goods under suspicious circumstances," he said.

If convicted, individuals may face a fine of up to RM1mil, imprisonment of up to three years, or both.

Roslee stressed that the ministry remains committed to strengthening cooperation with enforcement agencies such as the

police to curb the misappropriation of controlled goods, particularly subsidised diesel, which has significant implications for the national economy and public welfare.

"Strict action will be taken against any party found to be involved in the misuse of government subsidies," he said.

Sibu OCPD Asst Comm Azari Miskon said the vessel had been berthed at the jetty for about a month for engine repairs and was due to sail to the Solomon Islands.

The diesel was believed to be intended for the local market.

He added that Sibu's strategic

location makes it a hotspot for subsidised diesel smuggling and urged the public to provide information to the authorities.

Roslee stressed that the ministry remains committed to strengthening cooperation with enforcement agencies such as the police to curb the misappropriation of controlled goods, particularly subsidised diesel, which has significant implications for the national economy and public welfare.

"Strict action will be taken against any party found to be involved in the misuse of government subsidies," he said.

132,000 litres of diesel seized in KPDN, police ops

SIBU: A total of 132,000 litres of suspected smuggled diesel worth RM283,800 was seized during a joint operation by police and the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) at a jetty in Ulu Lanang here last Friday.

Sibu police chief ACP Azari Miskon said the operation involved officers from the Sarawak contingent police headquarters, Sibu Special Branch, and KPDN Sibu.

"The team raided and inspected a tugboat docked at a jetty in Ulu Lanang and found the diesel stored in nine tanks on board, with the fuel alone estimated to be worth RM283,800.

"The diesel is believed to have been brought in from outside for local distribution. The total value of the seizure, including the vessel and other items, is estimated at RM773,600," he told a press conference yesterday.

He said the caretaker of the vessel, a local man in his 60s, was detained on suspicion of being part of a diesel-smuggling syndicate.

Azari said initial investigations revealed that the vessel had been docked at the jetty for about a month, allegedly due to engine problems, while awaiting repairs before departing for the Solomon Islands.

He noted that Sibu had the potential to become a major hub

for smuggling activities involving subsidised diesel, adding that leakage of such fuel is significant in Sabah and Sarawak due to their proximity to international waters.

He said further investigations, including into the ownership of the vessel, were ongoing in collaboration with KPDN, while urging the public to come forward with information on any smuggling activities.

The case is being investigated under Section 21 of the Control of Supplies Act 1961, with the

suspect and seized items handed over to KPDN Sibu for further action.

Meanwhile, Sibu KPDN chief Roslee Masli said the ministry remained committed to strengthening strategic cooperation with enforcement agencies, including police, to curb the misappropriation of controlled goods, particularly subsidised diesel.

"Tough action will be taken against any parties involved in the misuse of government subsidies," he said.

He also advised the public against panic buying, assuring that supply would remain sufficient and under control, while encouraging them to play a role in combating leakage and manipulation of subsidised goods.

他说，此举是解决因西亚冲突引发全球能源危机，导致受管制物资走私及滥用风险上升，尤其是柴油与 RON95 汽油。

他说，“泄漏行动4.0”自3月16日推行至4月5日共展开8148项检查，并开档调查155宗案件，其中包括60宗柴油案件，充公总值逾210万令吉的柴油；47宗涉及 RON95 汽油，充公额达5万1299令吉；21宗涉及液化石油气，充公额为3万7822令吉；另有27宗涉及食用油、白糖及面粉案件。

法迪拉指出，政府不仅致力确保能源供应稳定，也加强对分销环节的监管与执法，以防止资源流失。

Kangar: Harga jualan runcut sayur di Pasar Sena di sini, mula menunjukkan peningkatan dengan peniaga mendakwa terpaksa menaikkan harga susulan kos logistik yang semakin meningkat.

Peniaga, Idrus Maidin, 68, berkata peningkatan harga sayur mula dikesan sejak dua sebulan lalu, apabila bermulanya kenaikan harga diesel susulan peperangan di Iran.

"Sayur seperti tomato, salad dan kubis dari Cameron Highlands mula menunjukkan trend kenaikan sejak dua hingga tiga minggu lalu. Turun naik harga sayur ini sebenarnya sangat bergantung kepada faktor bekalan dan logistik.

"Ketika cuaca elok dan bekalan sayur banyak, maka harga jualan di pasar akan turun. Namun, jika jadi masalah cuaca, hasil tanaman akan berkurangan dan harga jualan secara automatik naik," katanya ketika ditemui semalam.

Bagi peniaga, Sahirul Mohd Khir, 27 berkata, harga sayur secara keseluruhannya masih terkawal selepas berakhirnya musim perayaan Aidilfitri.

Katanya, bagaimanapun berapa lama syarikat pembekal sayur dapat menanam, kos logistik tidak diketahui dan harga sayur boleh berubah pada bila-bila masa sahaja.

"Setakat ini, harga sayur masih terkawal dan belum menunjukkan kenaikan mendadak walaupun terdapat sedikit perubahan pada bayaran kos pengangkutan.

"Biasanya, harga sayur hanya akan naik secara ketara pada musim perayaan seperti ketika Ramadan lalu. Semuanya akan bergantung kepada bekalan hujung bulan ini," katanya.

Tanaman kurang subur

Bagi peniaga sayur kampung, Abdul Razak Hasan, 73, berkata cuaca panas menyebabkan tanaman itu menjadi kurang subur dan agak sukar didapati ketika ini.

"Sayur kampung ini kebanyakannya ditanam untuk kegunaan sendiri dan lebihannya baru dijual ke pasar. Apabila cuaca terlalu panas, pokok tidak mengembang dan pertumbuhannya terjejas.

"Selain itu, kami juga menanggung kos penyusutan semasa memproses sayur. Contohnya, jika saya beli 10 kilogram (kg) serai, selepas dibersihkan dan dipotong untuk dijual, beratnya hanya tinggal sekitar enam hingga tujuh kg saja," katanya.

Sementara itu, suri rumah, Siti Masni Yusof, 46, berkata kenaikan kos pengangkutan dan bahan mentah sememangnya memberi kesan langsung kepada harga jualan.

"Harga sayur seperti kangkung yang dijual hari ini (semalam) ada sedikit peningkatan berbanding dahulu. Kita faham apabila kos pengangkutan naik, harga jualan di pasar akan meningkat.

"Cuma, harga ketika ini masih boleh diterima, sebagai pembeli kami terpaksa beli untuk dimasak dan dihidangkan kepada keluarga, namun jika harga terlalu mahal mungkin kena ubah kepada sayur lebih murah," katanya.

'Sewa RM3,000 jadi RM5,000'

- 1,000 pengusaha bas persiaran mohon subsidi bawah SKDS
- Kos naik, pelanggan batal tempahan

KOTA BHARU – Kira-kira 1,000 pengusaha bas persiaran di Pantai Timur yang tidak tergolong dalam senarai penerima subsidi menerusi Sistem Kawalan Diesel Bersubsidi (SKDS) berdepan situasi bakal 'gulung tikar' susulan kenaikan harga diesel.

Peningkatan harga diesel kepada RM6.02 seliter bagi tempoh 2 hingga 8 April mengakibatkan banyak tempahan sewaan bas persiaran dibatal pelanggan apabila kadar tambang untuk sebuah bas naik 30 hingga 40 peratus.

Timbalan Persatuan Bas Pantai Timur (Pebat), Wan Mohd. Nuhairi Wan Hamat berkata, bas persiaran tidak tergolong dalam syarikat yang layak menerima SKDS apabila kerajaan menetapkan subsidi diesel hanya kepada syarikat pelancongan yang besar.

Menurutnya, keadaan itu menyebabkan kesemua pengusaha

bas persiaran terpaksa menyerap kos mengisi diesel yang tinggi untuk terus bertahan dan membawa penumpang.

"SKDS hanya diberi kepada agensi pelancongan besar yang mempunyai pendapatan tetap seperti syarikat yang menguruskan pakej-pakej haji, umrah atau pelancong luar negara.

"Pengusaha bas persiaran merupakan penyedia perkhidmatan tempatan di negeri-negeri dan kami tidak mendapat SKDS. Keadaan ketika ini lebih rumit apabila banyak pihak yang membatalkan tempahan mereka selepas kadar tambang dinaikkan 30 hingga 40 peratus susulan peningkatan harga diesel.

"Sebagai contoh, sebelum ini sewaan bas persiaran untuk perjalanan pergi dan balik dari Kota Bharu ke Kuala Lumpur ditetapkan pada kadar RM3,000. Sejak peningkatan diesel, kami menaikkan kadar sewa sebuah bas mencecah RM5,000 dan ramai membatalkan tempahan kebela-kangan ini," katanya pada sidang akhbar selepas Himpunan Pengusaha dan Pemandu Bas Pantai Timur di sini semalam.

Seramai 50 pengusaha bas persiaran dari Kelantan, Terengganu dan Pahang berhimpun

untuk menuntut subsidi diesel daripada kerajaan selain menggesa Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim dan Kementerian Pelancongan, Seni dan Budaya termasuk Kementerian Kewangan campur tangan.

Jelas Wan Mohd. Nuhairi, jika peningkatan harga diesel berlarutan tanpa sebarang pemberian subsidi, pengusaha-pengusaha bas persiaran di Pantai Timur dijangka mampu bertahan dalam tempoh dua bulan lagi.

"Sebelum ini, pengusaha bas persiaran kurang mendapat tempahan sewaan bas bermula musim tengkujuh pada November dan Disember sehingga Ramadan lalu. Kami juga tidak terima tempahan pada Januari dan Februari lalu kerana belanjawan bagi kebanyakan sektor kerajaan terutamanya sekolah masih belum diluluskan pada waktu tersebut.

"Kami sedia berbincang dan menerima syarat yang ditetapkan kerajaan, asalkan bantuan dapat diberikan demi kelangsungan industri dan kebajikan pekerja. Kami berharap kerajaan dapat mempertimbangkan subsidi diesel pada kadar RM1.88 atau RM2.15 sama seperti penerima SKDS lain," katanya.

Pemilik syarikat Sri Gunong

Travel Sdn. Bhd., Wan Nurul Hakimah Wan Hamat berkata, syarikat milik keluarganya yang beroperasi sejak 1978 ketika ini berdepan tekanan yang berat selepas pandemik Covid-19.

"Sebanyak 15 trip sewaan bas melibatkan perjalanan jauh sudah dibatalkan pelanggan sejak hampir sebulan lalu.

"Syarikat kami mempunyai 10 buah bas dan empat daripadanya masih perlu dibayar ansuran setiap bulan. Jika ini berterusan, susah untuk kami membayar ansuran bas kerana perlu menyerap kos kenaikan diesel ditambah pula dengan pembatalan sewaan bas," katanya.

Pemandu bas persiaran, Mohd. Azuan Hamid, 45, berkata, situasi itu boleh menyebabkan dia hilang punca pendapatan kerana kekurangan tempahan bas sejak beberapa minggu lalu.

"Apabila perjalanan batal, sumber pendapatan dan aktiviti harian saya juga terjejas. Sebelum ini, saya boleh dapat upah RM300 untuk perjalanan pergi dan balik dari Kuala Lumpur.

"Saya juga bergantung kepada pengusaha bas. Jika mereka ada tempahan, maka saya akan ada kerja. Saya tiada gaji tetap seperti pemandu bas ekspres," ujunya.



Sabah's rice supply sufficient, no need for panic buying – Mustapha

KOTA KINABALU: Rice supplies in Sabah remain sufficient despite recent shortages reported at several major supermarkets in the Sepangar area.

Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Sabah and Sarawak) and member of Parliament for Sepangar, Datuk Mustapha Sakmud, said he is aware of public concerns but confirmed that monitoring shows rice stocks across the state are adequate.

"I have obtained detailed updates from the Sabah office of Padiberas Nasional Berhad (Bernas) and the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security regarding current rice reserves.

"I also visited storage warehouses to assess the supply firsthand, and our monitoring confirms that stocks are sufficient for Kota Kinabalu and the rest of Sabah," he said in a Facebook post yesterday.

He noted that the shortages in some supermarkets were caused by a surge in purchases driven by panic buying rather than an actual supply issue.

"This situation has caused major supermarkets and chain grocery stores to run out of stock faster than usual, while traditional markets and smaller shops continue to have sufficient supplies.

"I urge the public to avoid

panic buying and instead adopt prudent, needs-based grocery shopping," he added.

He also stressed that the Madani Government remains committed to safeguarding the nation's food security through coordinated monitoring by relevant ministries.

"Regular, integrated monitoring will be intensified across ministries, including the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security and the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living, to ensure public welfare remains protected despite global uncertainties and the energy crisis," he concluded. – Bernama
