KPDN wujud Pelan Tindakan Food Bank 2026-2030

Bangi: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) akan mewujudkan Pelan Tindakan Food Bank 2026-2030 yang dijangka siap dan akan dilancarkan pada awal tahun depan.

Menterinya, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali, berkata selepas enam tahun, program Food Bank diselia di bawah sekretariat kementerian sejak 2019 sudah tiba masanya satu transformasi dilaksanakan.

“Kita mahu program *Food Bank* menjadi pelengkap dan sokongan kepada ekosistem jaringan keselamatan yang ada di Malaysia.

“Melangkah ke hadapan bermula 2026, kita perlu melaksanakan transformasi dengan mengambil kira amalan terbaik dan pengalaman pelbagai pemegang taruh,” katanya di sini, semalam.

Armizan berkata, pelan tindakan itu akan memberi tumpuan kepada dua komponen utama iaitu kemampanan dan sekuriti makanan serta bagaimana ia berperanan dalam membantu kos sara hidup rakyat.

Pelan tindakan Food Bank Kebangsaan dilancar awal 2026

BANGI - Satu Pelan Tindakan Food Bank Kebangsaan 2026-2030 akan dilancarkan awal tahun depan, sebagai kerangka komprehensif bagi memperkukuh pelaksanaan inisiatif bantuan makanan dan memantapkan ekosistem jaringan keselamatan sosial negara.

Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata, pelan tindakan lima tahun itu kini dalam fasa penyediaan awal dan dibangunkan berasaskan Konvensyen Food Bank Malaysia 2025, yang berlangsung selama dua hari bermula Isnin.

Beliau berkata, hasil perbincangan, syor serta input daripada pelbagai pemegang taruh termasuk badan bukan kerajaan (NGO), pemain industri, peruncit, rangkaian hotel, sukarelawan komuniti dan agensi kerajaan akan digunakan sebagai asas kepada draf pelan tindakan berkenaan.

"Kita menyasarkan berdasarkan dapatan konvensyen ini, untuk mengadakan sesi libat urus susulan dengan kadar segera.

"Ia dokumen penting untuk menetapkan hala tuju, sasaran capaian serta kerangka pelaksanaan secara menyeluruh," katanya kepada pemberita selepas perasmian konvensyen

itu di sini pada Isnin.

Armizan berkata, pelan berkenaan perlu menetapkan matlamat jelas, termasuk sasaran capaian dalam tempoh lima tahun serta keperluan mengenal pasti kelompok masyarakat yang masih belum menerima bantuan makanan, terutama di kawasan tidak diliputi NGO sedia ada.

Beliau berkata, walaupun banyak NGO aktif melaksanakan program bank makanan sejak lebih dua dekad lalu, pendekatan bersepadu melibatkan kerajaan adalah penting bagi me-

mastikan keberkesanan, keseragaman standard, kawal selia dan pemantapan sokongan insentif.

"Pihak kementerian mahu memastikan transformasi Food Bank Kebangsaan dijangka dengan dua komponen utama, iaitu kelestarian dan keselamatan makanan dan digerakkan melalui konsep

kesepaduan dan tanggungjawab bersama," katanya.

Menurutnya, sejak diwujudkan pada 2019, Program Food Bank Malaysia yang diselia Sekretariat Food Bank KPDN telah memberi manfaat kepada 1,164,932 ketua isi rumah dan 51,200 pelajar, selain menyelamatkan 6,511 tan metrik lebih makanan melalui inisiatif keselamatan makanan.

Launch of National Food Bank Action Plan 2026-2030 next year

BANGI: The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) is targeting to launch the National Food Bank Action Plan 2026-2030 early next year as a comprehensive framework to enhance food aid initiatives and strengthen the nation's social safety net ecosystem.

Its Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the five-year action plan, currently in its initial preparation phase, and would be developed based on findings from the two-day Food Bank Malaysia Convention 2025, which started yesterday.

He said that the draft action plan would draw on the findings, feedback, and suggestions gathered from discussions with various stakeholders, including non-governmental organisations (NGOs), industry players, retailers, hotel chains and government agencies.

"Based on the outcomes of this convention, we aim to hold a follow-up engagement session as soon as possible.



Armizan (centre), said that a comprehensive transformation was needed to ensure the food bank programme remained relevant.

"Our target is to come out with the National Food Bank Action Plan 2026-2030 as early as next year, as it is an important document that sets the direction, outlines achievement targets, and provides a comprehensive implementation framework," he told reporters after officiating the convention here yesterday.

Armizan said that the plan should define clear objec-

tives, set five-year achievement targets, and identify communities that had yet to receive assistance, particularly in areas beyond the reach of existing NGOs.

According to him, although many NGOs had been actively implementing food bank initiatives for more than two decades, a government-integrated approach was crucial to ensure effectiveness, uniform

standards, proper regulation, and stronger incentive support.

"In the engagement session, some NGOs proposed that equipment assistance be provided or that tax incentives be considered.

"For me, any application to the government should be accompanied by complete documents showing the programme's effectiveness, its future potential,

and how it aligns with the government's major agenda," he said.

He added that KPDN aimed to ensure that the transformation of the food bank programme beginning in 2026 focused on two key aspects, namely sustainability and food security, in addition to reinforcing food banks as initiatives that helped ease the cost of living, driven by unity and collective responsibility.

Armizan also said that the implementation of the food bank should be in line with Malaysia's commitment to Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 12.3, which aims to reduce food waste by 50 per cent by 2030, while also supporting the environmental sustainability and public well-being objectives of the 13th Malaysia Plan.

"I believe that if this food bank initiative is aligned with the government's key agenda and properly documented, the central agency will give it due attention, given that it also benefits the less fortunate," he said.

The Food Bank Malay-

sia Convention, organised for the first time by KPDN, brought together over 1,000 participants, including government agencies, food industry players, retailers, hotel chains, NGOs, community volunteers, and eight key strategic partners of food banks nationwide.

Since its inception in 2019, the Malaysian Food Bank Programme, overseen by the KPDN Food Bank Secretariat, has benefited 1,164,932 households and 51,200 students, while also saving 6,511 tonnes of surplus food through the food rescue initiative.

Armizan said that a comprehensive transformation was needed to ensure the food bank programme remained relevant, more organised and capable of delivering a greater impact in line with current needs.

"With this national action plan, we are confident that the food bank initiative can be mobilised more effectively through a whole-of-nation approach, rather than in isolation," he said.

"Bagi saya, kalau kita mahu kemukakan permohonan tersebut kepada kerajaan, lebih baik kita datang dengan dokumen lengkap yang memaparkan keberkesanan program, potensi masa depan dan keselarasan dengan agenda besar kerajaan," katanya.

Beliau berkata kementeriaannya mahu memastikan transformasi program bank makanan bermula 2026 dijangka dengan dua komponen utama, iaitu kelestarian dan keselamatan makanan, serta peranan bank makanan sebagai inisiatif kebajikan yang membantu menangani kos sara hidup dan digerakkan melalui konsep kesepaduan dan tanggungjawab bersama.

Menurut Armizan, pelaksanaan bank makanan perlu diselaraskan dengan komitmen Malaysia terhadap Matlamat Pembangunan Mampan (SDG) 12.3, iaitu mengurangkan pembaziran makanan sebanyak separuh menjelang 2030, di samping

selari dengan fokus kelestarian alam dan kesejahteraan rakyat dalam Rancangan Malaysia Ke-13 (RMK13).

"Kalau kita dapat jajarkan inisiatif bank makanan ini dengan agenda besar kerajaan dan kita dokumenkan dengan baik, saya yakin agensi pusat akan memberi pertimbangan sewajarnya, apatah lagi program ini memberi manfaat kepada golongan kurang bernasib baik," katanya.

Konvensyen Food Bank Malaysia 2025 yang kali pertama dianjurkan Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup menghimpunkan lebih 1,000 peserta membabitkan agensi kerajaan, pemain industri pengeluaran makanan, peruncit, rangkaian hotel, NGO, sukarelawan komuniti serta lapan Rakan Strategik Utama (RSU) bank makanan di seluruh negara.

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DRESSED chicken, subsidised packets of cooking oil and eggs are some of the hottest items snapped up by Johor shoppers each time there is a “Jualan Rahmah Madani” (JRM).

Johor investment, trade, consumer affairs and human resources committee chairman Lee Ting Han said 5kg bottles of cooking oil and canned sardines were also popular items.

“We have seen a significant boost in federal support for the initiative this year, with RM39.4mil allocated for 2025, more than triple last year’s RM11.8mil.

“This increase reflects the government’s commitment to easing the *rakyat*’s spending pressure, especially in high-density B40 areas,” Lee told *StarMetro*.

JRM events were typically held at community halls, open spaces and residential areas to ensure accessibility for lower-income households.

“Each programme offers 40 to 50 types of items, including fish, chicken, vegetables, local fruits, wheat flour, cooking oil, detergent, disposable diapers, medicine and school supplies.

“JRM aims to cushion the rising cost of living by offering 10% to 30% discounts on essential goods

and ensure direct access to affordable necessities for the target group while stimulating local retail activities and strengthening the domestic economy.”

A nationwide programme under the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry implemented with supermarkets, retailers and private-sector partners, JRM was launched on Jan 11, 2023.

It had since been held in 600 constituencies, with each area hosting the programme at least twice a month throughout the year, said Lee.

The events were carried out via mobile sales, indoor and outdoor setups and wet market stalls.

During the tabling of Budget 2026, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim announced a RM1bil allocation for cost of

living support, including RM600mil for “Payung Rahmah” and JRM programmes.

StarMetro previously reported that Johor government also had its own version of the initiative called “Jualan Kasih Johor”, which provides much-needed relief to families living on a tight budget.

It, too, offered discounts like JRM on groceries and household goods.

开食物库大会 依成果拟定计划

国内贸易及生活费部长拿督阿米占指出，这份为期5年的行动计划目前处于初步筹备阶段，并依据今日起一连两天举行的2025年马来西亚食物库大会成果来制定。

他说，非政府组织、业者、零售商、连锁酒店、社区志愿者及政府机构等利益相关者的讨论成果、建议及意见，将作为草拟行动计划的基础。

“我们的目标是根据大会的成果，然后尽快举行后续交流会。”

“目标是最快在明年初推出2026至2030年全国食物库行动计划，因为这是

一份重要文件，制定方向、覆盖目标及全面的执行框架。”

他今日出席该大会开幕礼后，向记者这么说。

阿米占提到，该计划必须设定清晰目标，包括5年内的目标范围，以及识别仍未获得食物援助的社区群体，尤其是在未有非政府组织覆盖的地区。

让政府参与至关重要

他说，尽管许多非政府组织在过去20多年积极推动食物库计划，但让政府参与的综合模式至关重要，以确保有效、标准一致、监管完善及加强激励机制。

“在交流会上，一些非政府组织建议提供设备援助或考虑税务优惠。”

放眼2030年食物浪费减半

“如果我要向政府申请有关要求，最好准备完整资料，展示计划的成效、

未来潜力及与政府重大议程一致。”

他补充，该部希望从2026年起的食物库计划改革，符合两大元素，即食物可持续及安全，以及食物库作为福利倡议的角色，协助缓解生活成本，以及通过协作与共同责任理念推动。

他说，食物库的实施必须与我国对可持续发展目标（SDG）12.3的承诺保持一致，即在2030年将食物浪费减少一半，同时符合第13大马计划对环境可持续及人民福祉的关注。

内贸部首次举办的2025年马来西亚食物库大会吸引超过1000名参与者，包括政府机构、食品生产者、零售业者、连锁酒店、非政府组织、社区志愿者，以及全国8个主要食物库策略伙伴（RSU）。

内贸部食物库秘书处监管的大马食物库计划自2019年设立以来，已惠及116万4932名一家之主及5万1200名学生，同时通过食品安全倡议成功挽救6511公吨剩余食物。

Forward-buying interest to support demand

TIV is forecast at 800,500 units this year

PETALING JAYA: Automotive sales momentum is expected to be sustained as forward-buying interest, ahead of regulatory changes, supports demand, says Kenanga Research.

Vehicle sales rebounded to 75,992 units in October from 58,490 units in September, lifting year-to-date sales to 655,328 units as of end-October.

Kenanga Research has maintained a "neutral" rating on the sector and projects total industry volume (TIV) of 805,000 units in 2025, representing a 1.4% year-on-year decline from the record 816,747 units registered in 2024.

The research house said demand in the mass-market segment remained resilient, underpinned by affordable models and improved policy clarity, even as the industry prepares for regulatory changes next year.

It expected forward-buying activity to continue ahead of the implementation of new excise duty rules under the open market value (OMV) framework from 2026, as well as the discontinuation of incentives for fully imported completely built-up (CBU) electric vehicles (EVs) in the same year.

"Our 2025 TIV forecast of 805,000 units is a tad above the forecast of 780,000 by the Malaysian Automotive Association, backed by strong sustained demand in the affordable segment, fuel subsidies, attractive new launches and forward buying interest on pre-OMV excise duty hike and pre-discontinued EV CBU incentives both in 2026," it said.

It noted that the decision to expand fuel subsidies to Malaysians – instead of income-based targeting – has reduced uncertainty in the mid-market segment, although pricing pressure remains intense due to competition from value-for-money Chinese models.

Kenanga Research also expected Perusahaan Otomobil Kedua Sdn Bhd (Perodua) to be the main beneficiary of the policy shifts, as higher excise duties could be partly offset by its higher localisation rate.

Beyond policy factors, the research house said demand is expected to remain

supported by improving household incomes, including higher salaries for government servants effective last December, increase in the minimum wage from February and a stable labour market, with the unemployment rate forecast at 3% in 2025 compared with 3.3% in 2024.

On electrification, Kenanga Research said EV adoption would be gradual, citing infrastructure constraints and policy developments.

"We expect gradual transition to EVs which currently enjoy the sales and service tax exemption and other incentives until 2025 for imported CBUs and 2027 for locally-assembled completely knocked-downs.

"EV adoption will eventually pick up and petrol demand will peak but we do not think that will happen in the next five years due to infrastructure challenges."

With EVs targeted to account for 20% of new vehicle sales by 2030, Kenanga Research said the new petrol subsidy mechanism could slow the shift away from internal combustion engine vehicles particularly among the middle and lower-income consumers.

It highlighted gaps in charging infrastructure, noting that while more than 5,000 charging stations had been built, high installation costs and lengthy approval processes remained key challenges in achieving the 10,000-charger target nationwide by end-2025.

Meanwhile, Kenanga Research said the automotive sector saw an earnings recovery following a softer first half of financial year 2025.

It said that during the third quarter of

2025, 14% of the companies under its coverage delivered results above expectations, 57% were in line, while 29% came in below estimates.

Kenanga Research named MBM Resources Bhd and Hong Leong Industries Bhd as its top sector picks.

For MBM Resources, the research house cited strong earnings visibility supported by an outstanding *Perodua* order backlog of more than 89,000 units, exposure to the mass-market *Perodua* brand, and an attractive dividend yield of about 7%.

It also expected MBM Resources to benefit from new *Perodua* launches with higher margins, dealership expansion via the *Jaecoo* brand, and a down-trading trend favouring affordable vehicles.

Hong Leong Industries is favoured for its exposure to the gig economy through two-wheelers, its association with the *Yamaha* brand – which holds a leading position locally – and its strong balance sheet, with net cash of about RM2bil.

Kenanga Research highlighted Hong Leong Industries' dividend yield of 6%, and forecast robust motorcycle demand, with industry volume projected to reach a record 700,000 units in 2026, led by *Yamaha* with more than 50% market share.
