Warga asing beli RON95 akan dikenakan tindakan

Peraturan baharu di bawah pindaan akta tangani ketirisan subsidi petrol di sempadan

Kuala Lumpur: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup dalam proses meminda Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961 supaya bukan sahaja penjualan, tetapi juga pembeli warga asing petrol RON95 boleh dikenakan tindakan.

Menterinya, Datuk Armizan Ali berkata, ia antara peraturan baharu di bawah akta berkenaan bagi memperketatkan penguatkuasaan terhadap ketirisan subsidi petrol RON95, khususnya di kawasan sempadan negara berkuat kuasa 1 April depan.

Katanya, Kementerian sedang merangka peraturan itu mengikut Seksyen 6 akta berkenaan bagi perluaskan larangan bukan sahaja kepada penjualan, tetapi meliputi pembelian RON95 oleh kenderaan berpendaftaran asing.

"Ketika ini, tindakan hanya boleh diambil terhadap penjual. Melalui peraturan baharu ini, pembeli, termasuk pemilik atau pemandu kenderaan asing juga boleh dikenakan tindakan undang-undang

"Pada masa ini, sesi libat urus dijalankan bersama Jabatan Pengangkutan Jalan (JPJ) dan agensi sempadan bagi penyelidikan prosedur operasi standard penguatkuasaan," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian menjawab soalan Datuk Andi Muhammad Suryady Bandy (BN-Kalabakan) pada Waktu Pertanyaan bagi Jawab Lisan di Dewan Rakyat, semalam.

Bilangan kes meningkat

Berhubung data penguatkuasaan, Armizan berkata, bagi kawasan Sabah termasuk Tawau dan Kalabakan, bilangan kes berkaitan RON95 meningkat daripada lima kes pada 2023 kepada 13 kes pada 2024 dan 34 kes pada 2025, dengan nilai rampasan melonjak kepada RM40,993 tahun lalu.

"Pelaksanaan penyasaran subsidi RON95 masih baharu, namun pengalaman penyasaran

subsidi diesel sebelum ini menunjukkan trend penurunan ketirisan. Kerajaan optimis pendekatan berasaskan data dan sistem analitik mampu menutup ruang manipulasi subsidi

"Kementerian sentiasa memperkasa ketangkasan pemantauan dan penguatkuasaan untuk memastikan objektif penyasaran subsidi RON95 tercapai, khususnya melalui operasi bersepadu, OPS TIRIS dan kerjasama pendekatan serata negara melalui Gerakan Membanteras Manipulasi dan Ketirisan (KITA GEM-PUR)," katanya.

Beliau berkata, pelaksanaan program subsidi bersasar Budi MADANI RON95 berada di bawah seliaan Kementerian Kewa-

ngan sebagai peneraju dasar; manakala kementeriannya bertanggungjawab mengawal selia pelaksanaan Sistem Kawalan Petrol Bersubsidi (SKPS) dan penguatkuasaan di peringkat runcit.

"Selaras dengan pelaksanaan penuh Budi RON95 pada 30 September 2025, mekanisme penggunaan MyKad diperkenalkan bagi memastikan hanya warganegara layak berumur 16 tahun ke atas dan memiliki lesen memandu sah dapat membeli RON95 pada harga RM1.99 seliter.

"Pendekatan ini bertujuan memastikan subsidi dinikmati golongan sasar serta mengekang ketirisan termasuk aktiviti penyeludupan bahan api di kawasan sempadan," katanya.

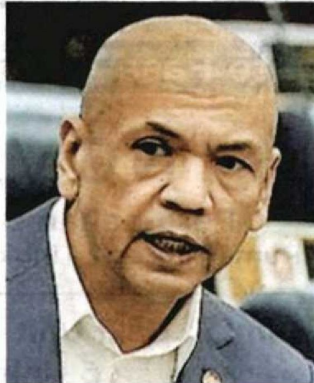
Pemandu kenderaan asing beli RON95 akan didenda

KUALA LUMPUR: Tindakan kepada pemilik kenderaan berpendaftaran asing merupakan antara peraturan baharu bagi membanteras ketirisan subsidi petrol RON95 di kawasan sempadan yang dijangka berkuat kuasa 1 April ini.

Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Armizan Mohd. Ali berkata, kementeriannya akan memperkenalkan peraturan baharu di bawah bawah Seksyen 6 Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961 (Akta 122) yang melarang pembelian RON95 oleh kenderaan pendaftaran asing.

Menurut beliau, peraturan sedia ada iaitu Peraturan 12A Peraturan-Peraturan Kawalan Bekalan 1974, larangan itu hanya terhad kepada penjualan RON95 bersubsidi kepada kenderaan ber-

pendaftaran asing.

“Maksudnya, larangan hanya kepada penjualan yang akan menyebabkan tindakan hanya akan diambil terhadap pengusaha stesen minyak tetapi tidak kepada pemilik atau pembeli yang menggunakan kenderaan pendaftaran

asing.

“Melalui peraturan baharu ini kelak, larangan dan tindakan undang-undang boleh diambil terhadap kedua-dua pihak iaitu stesen minyak dan juga pemilik atau pengguna kenderaan berpendaftaran asing,” katanya di Dewan Rakyat semalam.

Armizan berkata, Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) menyasarkan peraturan baharu itu akan siap dan boleh berkuat kuasa pada 1 April ini.

Beliau menjawab soalan tambahan dari Datuk Andi Muhammad Suryady Bandy (BN-Kalabakan) mengenai usaha memerangi ketirisan subsidi petrol RON95 yang disalurkan melalui program-program dilaksanakan di kawasan dan stesen minyak yang berada di kawasan sempadan.

Dalam pada itu, Armizan berkata, bagi memastikan pemantauan dan penguatkuasaan

subsidi RON95 di peringkat runcit, KPDN melaksanakan beberapa langkah-langkah antaranya pemeriksaan berkala di stesen minyak.

Katanya, KPDN juga melakukan penguatkuasaan larangan penjualan RON95 kepada kenderaan berpendaftaran asing dan kawalan pembelian luar tangki dengan larangan penjualan melebihi 20 liter tanpa permit khas.

Selain itu, katanya, pemantauan berkala turut dilakukan melalui buku log dan peti lawatan di stesen minyak bersempadan dan operasi penguatkuasaan bersepadu.

“Pengauditan rantaian bekalan melalui analisis corak jualan stesen minyak berisiko tinggi serta tindakan tegas terhadap pelanggaran juga dilaksanakan dan melakukan kerjasama dengan Jabatan Pendaftaran Negara (JPN) bagi menangani penyalahgunaan kad pengenalan,” katanya.

KUALA LUMPUR – Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) akan memperkenalkan peraturan baharu di bawah Seksyen 6 Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961 bagi melarang pembelian RON95 bersubsidi oleh kenderaan bernombor pendaftaran asing.

Menterinya, Datuk Armizan

Mohd. Ali berkata, di bawah peraturan sedia ada iaitu Peraturan 12A Peraturan-Peraturan Kawalan Bekalan 1974, larangan hanya terhad kepada penjualan petrol RON95 bersubsidi kepada kenderaan berpendaftaran asing.

“Maksudnya, larangan hanya kepada penjualan yang menyebabkan tindakan hanya akan diambil terhadap pengusaha stesen minyak, tetapi tidak kepada pemilik atau pembeli yang menggunakan kenderaan pendaftaran asing.”

“Melalui peraturan baharu ini kelak, larangan dan tindakan undang-undang boleh diambil terhadap kedua-dua pihak, stesen minyak dan juga pemilik atau pengguna kenderaan berpendaftaran asing,” katanya pada sidang Dewan Rakyat di sini semalam.

Beliau menjawab soalan Datuk Andi Muhammad Suryady Bandy (**BN-Kalabakan**) mengenai langkah komprehensif kerajaan bagi menjamin integriti serta keberkesanan pengurusan subsidi petrol.

Armizan berkata, usaha untuk memperkenalkan peraturan

baharu tersebut kini di peringkat libat urus dengan semua pihak terlibat dan KPDN menyasarkan ia dapat dimuktamadkan dan dikuat kuasa pada 1 April 2026.

Terdahulu, beliau berkata, KPDN terus memperkasa pemantauan serta penguatkuasaan subsidi petrol RON95 di peringkat runcit bagi memastikan penyaluran subsidi tepat kepada golongan sasaran dan mengekang ketirisan.

Kata beliau, antara langkah dilaksanakan termasuk pemeriksaan berkala di stesen minyak bagi memastikan pematuan mekanisme penggunaan kad pengenalan selain penguatkuasaan larangan penjualan RON95 kepada kenderaan berpendaftaran asing.

Menurut beliau, KPDN turut menguatkuasakan kawalan pembelian petrol luar tangki dengan menghadkan penjualan tidak melebihi 20 liter tanpa permit khas serta melaksanakan pemantauan berkala melalui buku log dan peti lawatan di stesen minyak di kawasan sempadan.

KUALA LUMPUR - Bermula 1 April ini, kedua-dua pihak iaitu stesen minyak dan pemilik atau pengguna kenderaan berpendaftaran asing boleh dikenakan tindakan undang-undang sekiranya melakukan jual beli RON95 bersubsidi.

Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata, ia berdasarkan peraturan baharu di bawah Seksyen 6, Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961 yang melarang 'pembelian' RON95 bersubsidi oleh kenderaan berpendaftaran asing. Katanya, sebelum ini di bawah

STEPPING UP ENFORCEMENT

NEW RULE TO PLUG RON95 LEAKAGES

Owners or drivers of foreign-registered vehicles who buy subsidised fuel will face legal action

KUALA LUMPUR

THE Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry is drafting a new regulation to enable action against owners of foreign-registered vehicles that purchase RON95 petrol, the Dewan Rakyat was told.

Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the move aimed to strengthen enforcement, particularly to curb subsidy leakages in border areas.

"Related to the issue of leakages in border areas, especially at petrol stations, the latest approach by the ministry is to introduce a new regulation under Section 6 of the Control of Supplies Act 1961 prohibiting the purchase of RON95 at petrol stations by (the owners or drivers of) foreign-registered vehicles," he said.

He was responding to Datuk Andi Muhammad Suryady Bandy (BN-Kalabakan), who asked

whether the ministry had any specific or additional monitoring or enforcement mechanisms to curb the leakage of RON95 subsidies in border areas.

Armizan said the ministry was targeting for the new regulation to be finalised and enforced from April 1.

He said existing legal provisions applied only to the sale of subsidised fuel.

"This means action can only be taken against petrol stations, not against owners or buyers using

foreign-registered vehicles," he said.

Under the new regulation, enforcement would be extended to individuals purchasing subsidised petrol.

Armizan added that the ministry was carrying out engagement sessions with stakeholders, including the Road Transport Department and border agencies, to develop a standard operating procedure for enforcement and integrate it into their systems.

Law soon to bar RON95 purchase for foreign cars

KUALA LUMPUR: The Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry is drafting new regulations to explicitly prohibit the purchase of RON95 petrol by foreign registered vehicles at petrol stations nationwide.

Its minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the move involves introducing new regulations under Section 6 of the Control of Supplies Act 1961 to strengthen control over the distribution of subsidised RON95 petrol.

He explained that the current legal framework under Regulation 12A only prohibits the sale of RON95, allowing enforcement action to be taken against petrol station operators but not against owners or buyers of foreign vehicle registrations.

"Through the new regulations that we are drafting, the prohibition would apply not only to sales but also to purchases. This means that individuals who buy, own or drive foreign registered vehicles could also be subject to enforcement action," he said during a question-and-answer session in the Dewan Rakyat yesterday.

Armizan said the ministry is currently holding engagement sessions with relevant stakeholders, with the new regulations targeted to be finalised and enforced from April 1.

He was responding to a supplementary question from Kalabakan MP Datuk Andi Muhammad Suryady Bandy on additional enforcement measures to curb leakage of RON95 subsidies, particularly at petrol stations in border areas.

Armizan said to strengthen monitoring and enforcement at the retail level, measures include periodic inspections at petrol stations to ensure compliance with the use of identity card mechanisms and enforcement of the ban on sales involving foreign registered vehicles.

pumped up enforcement

KUALA LUMPUR: From April 1, action will be taken against owners of foreign-registered vehicles who buy RON95 petrol at petrol stations nationwide, says the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry.

Its minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali (*pic*) said the move involves introducing new regulations under Section 6 of the Control of Supplies Act 1961 to strengthen control over the distribution of subsidised RON95 petrol.



He added that currently, Regulation 12A only prohibits the sale of RON95, allowing enforcement action to be taken against petrol station operators but not against owners or buyers of foreign vehicle registrations.

"Through the new regulations that we are drafting, the prohibition will apply not only to sales but also to purchases. This means that individuals purchasing or operating foreign-registered vehicles can also be subject to enforcement action," he told the Dewan Rakyat yesterday.

Armizan said the ministry is engaging with stakeholders, including the Road Transport Department (JPJ) and border security authorities to incorporate the standard operating procedure into their respective systems.

He was responding to Datuk Andi Muhammad Suryady Bandy (BN-Kalabakan), who asked on additional enforcement measures to curb leakage of RON95 subsidies, particularly at petrol stations in border areas of Malaysia.

Armizan said measures including periodic inspections at petrol stations are conducted to strengthen monitoring and enforcement at the retail level.

He said this includes ensuring compliance with the use of MyKad as a verification mechanism and the enforcement of the ban on sales of RON95 petrol to foreign-registered vehicles.

Additional controls include a ban on fuel purchases outside vehicle tanks exceeding 20 litres without a special permit, as well as regular monitoring through logbooks and visit records at petrol stations in border areas.

He said enforcement efforts are also carried out through integrated operations with the police, the Armed Forces, Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency (MMEA), Customs Department and the Malaysian Border Control and Protection Agency (AKPS) to combat subsidy leakage and smuggling.

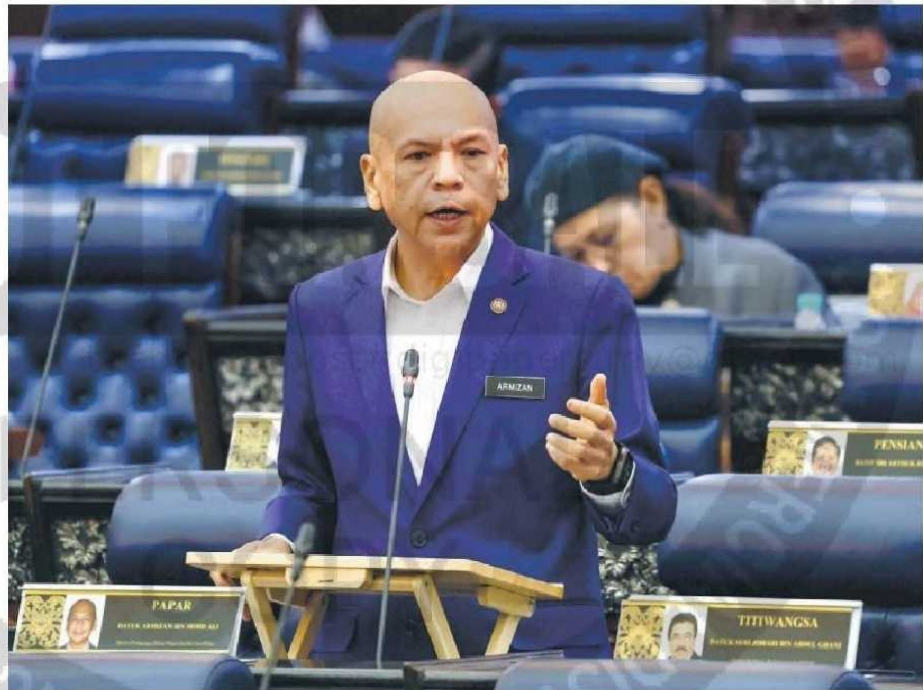

He said enforcement efforts are also carried out through integrated operations with the Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM), Malaysian Armed Forces (ATM), Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency (MMEA), Royal Malaysian Customs Department (JKDM) and the

Malaysian Border Control and Protection Agency (AKPS) to combat subsidy leakage and smuggling.

"KPDN will continue to strengthen its monitoring and enforcement capabilities to ensure the objectives of RON95 subsidy targeting are achieved, particularly through Ops Tiris and the nationwide collaborative initiative to combat manipulation and leakage, known as Kita Gempur," he said.

Touching on the Essential Goods Distribution Programme (PBP), Armizan said improvements to prevent leakage include changes to

the procurement method, with delivery companies or transporters appointed through an open tender system starting in 2023, replacing the previous direct appointment approach.

He added that claims from suppliers to transporters are now required to be recorded and supported with uploaded photographs to qualify for reimbursement.

"We are also exploring the use of advanced technology to enable more comprehensive monitoring and enforcement, ensuring essential goods reach interior and remote areas," he said. — Bernama

Tighter laws needed to curb fuel theft

Drivers of foreign-registered vehicles should be held accountable for illegal subsidy purchases

ATTENDANTS moving through traffic to warn foreign-registered vehicle owners against pumping subsidised RON95 has become a common sight at petrol stations near the two land checkpoints in Johor Baru.

One station has even resorted to blaring the message around the clock that foreign-registered cars are restricted to the RON97 grade.

Despite these efforts, cases of Singaporeans or Malaysians in Singapore-registered vehicles attempting to fill up on subsidised petrol remain a problem.

The latest uproar occurred earlier this month when a 64-year-old Singapore permanent resident was caught on video concealing certain letters on his number plate to make it look local and illegally pumping RON95 at a petrol station in Kulai.

The video, filmed on Jan 2, went viral and sparked outrage among online users over the lengths some will go to for subsidised fuel.

Police tracked down the man in question, and he was charged and fined RM9,000 on Jan 14.

The retiree paid the fine for number plate tampering, but the

case also raised a pertinent question – why was he not charged for the act of purchasing the subsidised fuel also?

A quick check revealed a vast difference in petrol prices between Malaysia and the island republic, with Malaysia's RON97 priced at RM3.10 per litre, while Singapore's lowest-grade petrol, 92-octane, is priced at S\$2.84 (RM8.89) per litre (see graphic).

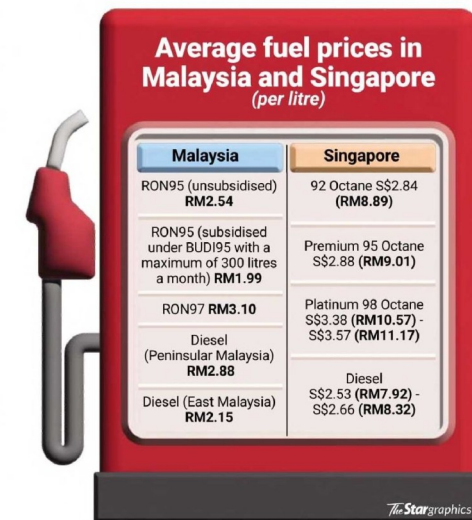
Under Singaporean law, all vehicles exiting the country are required to have at least three-quarters of a tank of fuel or risk a S\$500 (RM1,561) fine.

Random checks are carried out by local authorities at the Woodlands and Tuas checkpoints.

However, this latest tampering case has brought to light some loopholes in the system that need to be plugged.

Lawyer Norman Fernandez pointed out that under the Control of Supplies Act 1961, the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) usually takes action against petrol station operators for selling subsidised petrol, while buyers often walk away unscathed.

He lamented that there were currently no specific laws to



prosecute foreigners who fill foreign-registered vehicles with subsidised fuel.

"This issue has been going on for years," said Fernandez.

"Recent viral cases further highlight the need to take action against those committing the act," he said.

He added that under present

law, petrol station operators face fines of up to RM1mil or three years' imprisonment.

Fernandez suggested that, as a temporary measure, authorities could use Sections 415 and 420 of the Penal Code to charge buyers for cheating and obtaining fuel through deception.

However, the next question would be whether the police or KPDN should enforce this law.

The issue has also reached Parliament, with Tebrau MP Jimmy Pua Wee Tse urging for existing laws to be amended and proposing that such offenders be blacklisted from entering Malaysia for up to two years.

He also suggested installing LED signage at all checkpoints nationwide to inform drivers of foreign-registered vehicles that they are only allowed to pump RON97 in Malaysia.

The issue of foreign-registered vehicles filling up on subsidised petrol is not just limited to the south, but also occurring in the northern border states with Thailand and states bordering Indonesia.

For Singaporeans, Johor is a cheap weekend or holiday getaway to shop for groceries, enjoy a good meal and obtain cheap fuel.

The government needs to act quickly and decisively to curb this leakage, which likely costs the country tens of millions of ringgit.

Once the relevant laws are amended, the agencies concerned should strictly enforce them.

Malaysia needs to review and update its laws, especially those governing the sale and purchase of subsidised fuel, so that when a law is broken, both the seller and buyer can be held accountable.

KPDN drafting new regulations to ban RON95 petrol purchase by foreign-registered vehicles

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To strengthen monitoring and enforcement at the retail level, he said measures include

periodic inspections at petrol stations to ensure compliance with the use of identity card mechanisms and enforcement of the ban on sales to foreign-registered vehicles.

Additional controls include a ban on fuel purchases outside vehicle tanks exceeding 20 litres without a special permit, as well as regular monitoring through logbooks and visit records at petrol stations in border areas.

He said enforcement efforts are also carried out through integrated operations with the Royal Malaysia Police, Malaysian Armed Forces, Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency, Royal Malaysian Customs Department, and the Malaysian Border Control and Protection Agency to combat subsidy leakage and smuggling.

"KPDN will continue to strengthen its monitoring and enforcement capabilities to ensure the objectives of RON95 subsidy targeting are achieved, particularly through Ops Tiris and the nationwide collaborative initiative to combat manipulation and leakage, known as Kita Gempur," he said.

Touching on the Essential Goods Distribution Programme, Armizan said improvements to prevent leakage include changes to the procurement method, with delivery companies or transporters appointed through an open tender system starting in 2023, replacing the previous direct appointment approach.

He added that claims from suppliers to transporters are now required to be recorded and supported with uploaded photographs to qualify for reimbursement. — Bernama

Inspections disprove claims of price hikes in Penang

GEORGE TOWN: The Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry has dismissed claims of sharp price increases in vegetables ahead of Thaipusam and Chinese New Year, saying monitoring across Penang shows prices remain largely stable.

State director S. Jegan said daily checks conducted by the ministry's price monitoring officers indicated no significant statewide spike in vegetable prices.

"Daily monitoring is conducted at 45 public markets, 13 hypermarkets and 18 supermarkets across all districts in Penang, involving the collection of prices for 41 types of vegetables."

He added that the monitored items included those cited by the Penang Hindu Association (PHA) such as tomatoes, ginger, okra, cauliflower, long beans, coconuts (medium size), green and red chillies, onions, cabbage, lime and carrots.

"Our analyses show that for several items, prices recorded only marginal changes, while some items showed a decline between December 2025 and January 2026."

On Jan 27, PHA said a survey had found price increases of between 14% and 100% for 15 essential food items.

Jegan said ministry data showed the average retail price of tomatoes rose moderately from RM6.56 per kg in December to RM7.28 per kg in January while ginger prices edged slightly lower from RM9.85 to RM9.82 per kg.

"For okra and cauliflower, average prices fell from RM13.10 to RM9.99 per kg and from

RM10.24 to RM8.82 per kg respectively," he said, adding that long beans, cabbage and carrots recorded either minimal movement or stable prices over the same period.

He also said discrepancies between PHA's findings and ministry data could be attributed to differences in supply chains and retail structures.

"Vegetable supplies are sourced from different suppliers and wholesalers, and prices are influenced by order quantities."

"Hypermarkets usually procure supplies in bulk through their own distribution centres, while smaller retailers rely on wholesale markets."

He also said for items not included in the ministry's daily monitoring, spot checks were conducted.

"Prices for large mangoes ranged from RM6.50 to RM8.00 per kg, brinjal from RM9.00 to RM11.00 per kg and moringa from RM12.00 to RM15.00 per kg."

Jegan said enforcement officers had been instructed to intensify inspections at public markets, morning and night markets, farmers' markets and supermarkets.

He reminded traders that they are required to clearly display price tags, use verified weighing instruments and ensure sufficient supply of controlled goods.

He also warned that legal action would be taken against traders found profiteering under the Price Control and Anti-Profitteering Act 2011, Control of Supplies Act 1961, Weights and Measures Act 1972 and the Consumer Protection Act 1999.

KPDN dismisses price-hike reports, assures essentials prices stable

GEORGE TOWN: The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) has assured consumers that the prices of essential goods in Penang remain stable, dismissing reports of sharp price hikes ahead of Thaipusam and Chinese New Year.

State KPDN Director S Jegan said through the 'Price Catcher' initiative, the ministry monitors prices of 41 types of vegetables, including those reportedly subject to increases, across 45 public markets, 13 hypermarkets and 18 supermarkets.

"Analysis shows that most items, such as tomatoes, ginger, lady's fingers, cauliflower, long beans, cabbage and carrots, show only minor changes and remain within a reasonable price range. In fact, the prices of certain items dropped compared to the previous month," he said in a statement yesterday.

He was commenting on the Penang Hindu Association's (PHA) concerns regarding the rising prices of basic food items ahead of the festive season, following consumer complaints.

PHA president Datuk P Murugiah reportedly said that the association surveyed several retail outlets and wet markets on Jan 26, which found that prices for 15 key staples had risen between 14 and 100 per cent in the past month.

Jegan refuted these claims, saying the average retail price of tomatoes, for example, only rose from RM6.56 per kg in December to RM7.28 in January 2026.

Meanwhile, ginger prices held steady at around RM9.80 per kg, and prices for lady's fingers and cauliflower had actually fallen significantly, from RM13.10 to RM9.99 and from RM10.24 to RM8.82, respectively.

Regarding PHA's claims of up to 100 per cent increases for large mangoes, brinjals, and moringa, he clarified that these items are not monitored daily. Nonetheless, current checks found their prices remain within the normal market range. — Bernama

Industri muzik Malaysia mencatat pendapatan keseluruhan RM428.3 juta sepanjang 2025, iaitu rekod yang dianggap memberangsangkan berbanding RM352.4 pada 2024, mengikut data diumumkan Persatuan Industri Rakaman Malaysia (RIM).

Peningkatan 17.7 peratus itu menandakan paras pendapatan tertinggi pernah dicapai industri muzik tempatan, setakat ini.

RIM mengumumkan pendapatan utama diperoleh daripada perkhidmatan penstriman muzik digital dan diikuti kutipan oleh Pertubuhan Pengurusan Kolektif (CMO).

Lantas ini mencerminkan pelaburan berterusan syarikat rakaman dan penggunaan muzik yang tinggi dalam kalangan rakyat Malaysia merentas pelbagai genre dan bahasa.

Pengerusi RIM, Rosmin Hashim, berkata sepanjang 2025, beberapa artis Malaysia menca-

tatkan kejayaan cemerlang pada peringkat serantau melalui kerjasama bersama rakan artis dari negara jiran.

"Penyanyi popular tanah air, Ernie Zakri mencipta kejayaan besar menerusi lagu *Masing-Masing*, hasil kolaborasi bersama penulis lagu dan pemain gitar Indonesia, Ade Govinda.

"Kumpulan Dolla pula bergandingan dengan bintang hip hop Thailand, Tobii, menerusi lagu *Bad Girls Like You*, yang menerima sambutan hangat pada peringkat serantau.

"Selain itu, beberapa kolaborasi lain turut mencuri perhatian termasuk duet Aina Abdul dan Insomniacs bersama artis Indonesia masing-masing, Fabio Asher dan Nabila Taqiyah," katanya dalam kenyataannya.

"Tindakan konsisten ini menyumbang peningkatan pendapatan industri muzik," katanya.

Pengerusi Persatuan Industri Rakaman Malaysia (RIM), Rosmin Hashim berkata, jumlah itu menunjukkan peningkatan luar biasa sebanyak 17.7 peratus berbanding RM352.4 juta yang direkodkan pada tahun sebelumnya.
