KPDN perkukuh penguatkuasaan menerusi Ops Tiris 4.0

KOTA KINABALU: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) Sabah terus memperkukuh penguatkuasaan melalui Ops Tiris 4.0 Bersepadu.

Langkah berkenaan diambil susulan kejayaan memperoleh satu lagi sabitan terhadap seorang individu yang didapati berurus niaga dengan barang kawalan berjadual iaitu diesel tanpa lesen yang sah.

Pengarah KPDN Sabah Shahril Nizam Shahidin menegaskan pihaknya akan terus memperhebatkan operasi penguatkuasaan melalui Ops Tiris 4.0 Bersepadu dengan kerjasama strategik bersama agensi-agensi penguatkuasa berkaitan bagi membanteras penyelewengan barang kawalan selain memastikan subsidi kerajaan sampai kepada golongan sasaran.

"KPDN juga tidak akan berkompromi terhadap mana-mana individu atau pihak yang cuba mengambil kesempatan untuk menyalahgunakan barang kawalan sehingga menjejaskan kepentingan rakyat dan menyebabkan ketirisan hasil negara.

"Kita turut mengingatkan tindakan lucut hak terhadap barang sitaan termasuk kenderaan boleh dikenakan oleh mahkamah selain hukuman denda dan penjara sebagai langkah tegas bagi membendung aktiviti penyelewengan ini.

Terdahulu menerusi prosiding yang berlangsung di Mahkamah Sesyen 7 Kota Kinabalu pada 25 Jun lalu Abdul Salam Bin Ismail, 36, mengaku bersalah atas pertuduhan di bawah Peraturan 3(1) Peraturan-Peraturan Kawalan Bekalan 1974 yang dibaca bersama Seksyen 21 Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961 (Akta 122).

Berdasarkan fakta kes hasil maklumat risikan pada 19 April 2026, sepasukan anggota Pasukan Polis Marin Wilayah 4 Sabah telah menjalankan pemeriksaan di kawasan parkir Jalan Tugu, Kota Kinabalu.

Hasil pemeriksaan menemukan 186 liter minyak diesel di dalam sebuah tangki IBC berkapasiti 1,000 liter yang diletakkan di bahagian belakang sebuah kenderaan Toyota Hilux Rocco.

Siasatan lanjut mendapati tertuduh tidak memiliki lesen yang sah bagi menjalankan urus niaga barang kawalan berjadual tersebut.

Sehubungan itu mahkamah telah menjatuhkan hukuman denda sebanyak RM10,000.00 atau enam bulan penjara sekiranya gagal membayar denda namun tertuduh telah menjelaskan denda yang dikenakan.

Man fined for illegal possession of subsidised diesel

KOTA KINABALU: The Sessions Court here fined a 36-year-old man RM10,000 in default six months' imprisonment for dealing in subsidised diesel without a valid licence under Ops Tiris 4.0 Bersepadu.

Judge Hurman Hussain convicted Abdul Salam Ismail on his own guilty plea to a charge under Regulation 3(1) of the Control of Supplies Regulations 1974, read together with Section 21 of the Control of Supplies Act 1961.

The court heard that acting on intelligence, a team from the Sabah Region 4 Marine Police carried out an inspection at a parking area on Jalan Tugu where they discovered 186 litres of diesel stored in an intermediate bulk container

with a capacity of 1,000 litres placed in the rear of a pickup truck.

Further investigations found that Abdul Salam did not possess a valid licence to trade in the controlled item. He paid the fine.

The court also ordered that RM774.09, representing proceeds from the sale of the diesel, to be forfeited to the government, along with all seized items except the vehicle, which was returned to its registered owner.

Under Section 22(1) of the Control of Supplies Act 1961, a first-time offender may be fined up to RM1 million, jailed for up

to three years, or both.

The prosecution was conducted by Malai Rosidi Malai Muhamad, while Abdul Salam was unrepresented.

In a statement, the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) Sabah said it will continue to intensify enforcement under Ops Tiris 4.0 through strategic cooperation with relevant agencies to curb the misappropriation of controlled goods and ensure subsidies reach eligible groups.

"KPDN will not compromise with any individual or party attempting to exploit controlled goods for personal gain at the expense of the rakyat and national revenue," said KPDN Sabah director Shahril Nizam Shahidin.

Members of the public can report such activities via KPDN's official complaint channels.

当局进一步调查显示，被告并未持有合法执照经营受管制柴油交易，因此遭到提控。

根据 1961 年供应管制法令第 22 (1) 条文，初犯者最高可被判罚款 100 万令吉、监禁

3 年，或两者兼施。

此案由马来罗斯迪主控，被告则没有聘请律师代表。

Membership in copyright group

Royalties: Single hit wonders now eligible

KOTA KINABALU: Music Authors' Copyright Protection (MACP) Berhad has lowered its membership threshold to a single song with at least 1,000 streaming views, opening the door for more independent and first-time music creators in Sabah to collect royalties.

"We do not want one-hit wonders missing out on their royalties just because of strict membership requirements," MACP Chief Operations Officer Lucas Lai told a media conference during the MACP Jelajah Malaysia Timur 2.0 here.

"Where does this royalty sit? The companies are going to take it. And that is not what we want," he said, adding that the royalties should go to those who created the music.

Previously, music creators were required to submit five musical works to qualify for MACP membership. The threshold has since been lowered to one song with at least 1,000 streaming views on platforms such as Spotify and TikTok. Membership registration is free.

The updated membership requirement was announced during the second edition of the Jelajah Malaysia Timur programme, which drew a strong turnout and registered new members on the spot.

Lucas said the first edition last year had far exceeded expectations, with more than 130 attendees turning up against an initial estimate of 40 to 50, while between 30 and 40 new members signed up.

Follow-up activities have since been held with Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) and Akademi Seni Budaya dan Warisan Kebangsaan (Aswara).

The return visit is intended to give creators more opportunities for face-to-face engagement and discussions on copyright and royalty matters.

"We want to show that we care about the people here. We are likely going to do more if the reception or turnout is good," Lucas said, adding that MACP is committed to maintaining its presence in East Malaysia.

MACP East Malaysia Director Roger Wang said the membership change reflected how music consumption had evolved.

"Last time, a hit song was only through albums. A composer can have just one song, it goes viral, and there is a pool of royalties they cannot collect simply because they only have one song and cannot qualify for membership," he said.

Roger also said the questions raised at both Jelajah events showed that awareness among Sabahan creators already existed.

"The awareness is there, but maybe they do not yet know the way. That is where we hope to come in, to give them mentorship and guidance," he said.

"This awareness campaign is not only for Sabah. It is the same whether in Sarawak or Peninsular Malaysia. There are many who may not fully understand copyright. This is a continuous process," he added.

He cited Rey Guntabid's Kadazan-

dusun-language song "Lumangad Oku Dika" reaching the Anugerah Juara Lagu (AJL) final as a sign of growing national recognition for Sabah composers.

For the record, "Lumangad Oku Dika" advanced to this year's AJL final, marking a rare and historic achievement for a Kadazandusun-language song on the national stage.

"First time you have a Sabahan ethnic title song in Juara Lagu. The time for Sabah and Sarawak composers is coming. It is a good time that MACP is stepping in to give them a good platform," he said.

Meanwhile, Recording Industry Association of Malaysia (RIM) Chairman Rosmin Hashim, who also represented the Music Publishers Association of Malaysia (MPA), said the membership change was about being more inclusive, particularly towards independent artists.

"Nowadays you have a lot of do-it-yourself artists coming out with recordings. Some of their recordings, although do-it-yourself, become big hits. They should also be able to generate royalties from public performances of the songs they have recorded, regardless of whether they operate as sole proprietors, partnerships or companies," he said.

He added that AI-generated music would not be accepted under the relaxed criteria, saying the industry did not recognise such works for membership purposes.

Rosmin, who is also Chairman of Public Performance Malaysia Berhad (PPM), cited Jimmy Palikat's "Anak Kampung", re-recorded with One Nation Emcees, as a long-running example of the royalty-earning potential for local creators.

"In 2012, that song was the highest-selling ringtone in the entire peninsula. We have paid a lot of royalties to Jimmy Palikat from that song up until now because it is still being played frequently in karaoke outlets. This is generating a lot of income for the songwriter," he said.

This year, MACP also collaborated with UMS and the Sabah Institute of Arts (SIA). Saturday's programme included performances by Dabra Sia, Hezron of Atmosfera and creative students from both institutions, as well as a Kahoot session with Kupi-Kupi FM.

MACP also announced two new award categories exclusively for East Malaysian members at the upcoming Anugerah MACP 2026, recognising the contributions of creators from Sabah and Sarawak.

MACP is an independent, non-profit company that operates as a licensed royalty collection body under the Malaysian Copyright Act.

It is regulated by the Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO), an agency under the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living, which sets the governance and legal framework within which MACP operates.

On broader creative industry policy matters, including artificial intelligence in music and the digital creative economy, MACP works closely with the Ministry of Communications.

Bekalan bahan api mencukupi sehingga Ogos

Kerajaan memaklumkan bekalan bahan api mencukupi sehingga Ogos ini, manakala bekalan beras negara termasuk stok penimbal pula mencukupi bagi tempoh antara lima hingga enam bulan.

Menteri Ekonomi, Akmal Nasrullah Mohd Nasir, berkata bekalan makanan asas seperti ayam, telur, ikan, susu dan buah-buahan mencukupi bagi tempoh sekurang-kurangnya sebulan.

"Justeru, kerajaan sedang berusaha memastikan bekalan bahan api terus terjamin supaya aktiviti harian rakyat, pengang-

kutan awam, logistik, perniagaan dan sektor kritikal dapat terus beroperasi.

"Pemantauan harga barangan keperluan mengikut lokasi juga dilaksanakan melalui platform PriceCatcher KPDN yang memantau 316 barangan keperluan di lebih 2,000 premis runcit seluruh negara dengan sokongan 850 pegawai pemantau harga.

"Penguatkuasaan terhadap pencatutan dan penyeludupan turut dipertingkatkan supaya tekanan global tidak dimanipulasi untuk menaikkan harga secara tidak munasabah," katanya pada

sesi penerangan mengenai krisis bekalan global di Dewan Rakyat semalam.

Sementara itu, Akmal Nasrullah memaklumkan sebanyak 27 daripada 120 keputusan Majlis Tindakan Ekonomi Negara (MTEN) bagi menyerap kesan awal krisis bekalan global susulan konflik di Asia Barat, sudah dilaksanakan.

K'jaan beri perhatian keterjaminan bekalan, kawal harga barangan asas

KUALA LUMPUR: Kerajaan memberi perhatian khusus kepada keterjaminan bekalan barangan keperluan, kawalan harga barangan asas dan peningkatan kecekapan saluran pengedaran bagi mengurangkan kesan kenaikan harga kepada rakyat.

Menteri Ekonomi Akmal Nasrullah Mohd Nasir berkata dalam sektor makanan, kenaikan kos logistik dan input pertanian memberi tekanan kepada harga barangan pengguna dengan sebanyak 63 peratus keperluan baja negara bergantung kepada sumber import.

"Berdasarkan penilaian semasa, kos baja diunjurkan meningkat antara 15 hingga 20 peratus, manakala kos makanan ternakan meningkat sekitar lapan peratus," katanya ketika menyampaikan Sesi Penerangan Menteri mengenai Krisis Bekalan Global di Dewan Rakyat, Isnin.

Beliau berkata bagi menstabilkan bekalan dan harga, kerajaan turut melaksanakan pemantauan harian ke atas bekalan dan harga barangan keperluan.

Katanya penyelarasan turut dibuat bersama Petroliam Nasional Berhad (Petronas) dan pemain industri untuk memantau kedudukan stok dan melaksanakan langkah kontingensi supaya keperluan pengguna serta ekonomi utama tidak terjejas selain memastikan bekalan tenaga negara kekal stabil.

"Sehingga kini, kerajaan dapat memastikan bekalan bahan api mencukupi sehingga Ogos 2026 dan sedang berusaha untuk memastikan bekalan bahan api terus terjamin. Ini penting supaya aktiviti harian rakyat, pengangkutan awam, logistik, perniagaan dan sektor kritikal dapat terus beroperasi," katanya.

Akmal Nasrullah berkata bekalan beras negara termasuk stok penimbun juga masih terkawal dan mencukupi untuk tempoh lima hingga enam bulan



manakala bekalan makanan asas seperti ayam, telur, ikan, susu dan buah-buahan mencukupi untuk tempoh sekurang-kurangnya sebulan.

Government to ensure lower global oil prices translate into cheaper goods

KUALA LUMPUR: The government will continue monitoring the decline in global oil prices and ensure the lower costs are passed on to consumers through cheaper goods, Economy Minister Akmal Nasrullah Mohd Nasir said.

The minister said that although Malaysia had successfully contained sharp price increases during the energy crisis through targeted subsidy programmes such as BUDI MADANI and the

Subsidised Diesel Control System, the government's focus has now shifted to ensuring consumers benefit from the downward trend in energy prices.

"When prices show a downward trend, this is an opportunity for us to ensure the decline is reflected in line with falling energy costs.

"The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living must ensure there are no elements of profiteering or opportunistic

pricing that continue to burden consumers when operating costs have already begun to decline," he said when winding up the ministerial explanation session on the global supply crisis in the Dewan Rakyat yesterday.

Akmal Nasrullah said, besides monitoring prices, the government was also paying close attention to the financial position of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) to ensure they maintained healthy

cash flow amid economic uncertainty.

He said Bank Negara Malaysia (BNM) had allocated RM5 billion under its SME Relief and Recovery Facility to support small and medium enterprises, including MSMEs affected by the ongoing conflict in West Asia.

More than 1,000 MSMEs have utilised the facility, with RM700 million in financing approved, he added. — Bernama

Krisis bekalan global: Kerajaan beri perhatian keterjaminan bekalan, kawal harga barangan asas

KUALALUMPUR: Kerajaan memberi perhatian khusus kepada keterjaminan bekalan barangan keperluan, kawalan harga barangan asas dan peningkatan kecekapan saluran pengedaran bagi mengurangkan kesan kenaikan harga kepada rakyat.

Menteri Ekonomi Akmal Nasrullah Mohd Nasir berkata dalam sektor makanan, kenaikan kos logistik dan input pertanian memberi tekanan kepada harga barangan pengguna dengan sebanyak 63 peratus keperluan baja negara bergantung kepada sumber import.

"Berdasarkan penilaian semasa, kos baja diunjurkan meningkat antara 15 hingga 20 peratus, manakala kos makanan ternakan meningkat sekitar lapan peratus," katanya ketika menyampaikan Sesi Penerangan Menteri mengenai Krisis Bekalan Global di Dewan Rakyat semalam.

Beliau berkata bagi menstabilkan bekalan dan harga, kerajaan turut melaksanakan pemantauan harian ke atas bekalan dan harga barangan keperluan.

Katanya penyelarasan turut dibuat bersama Petroliaam Nasional Berhad (Petronas) dan pemain industri untuk memantau kedudukan stok dan melaksanakan langkah

kontingensi supaya keperluan pengguna serta ekonomi utama tidak terjejas selain memastikan bekalan tenaga negara kekal stabil.

"Sehingga kini, kerajaan dapat memastikan bekalan bahan api mencukupi sehingga Ogos 2026 dan sedang berusaha untuk memastikan bekalan bahan api terus terjamin. Ini penting supaya aktiviti harian rakyat, pengangkutan awam, logistik, perniagaan dan sektor kritikal dapat terus beroperasi," katanya.

Akmal Nasrullah berkata bekalan beras negara termasuk stok penimbal juga masih terkawal dan mencukupi untuk tempoh lima hingga enam bulan manakala bekalan makanan asas seperti ayam, telur, ikan, susu dan buah-buahan mencukupi untuk tempoh sekurang-kurangnya sebulan.

Selain itu, beliau berkata Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) juga akan terus memantau 316 barangan keperluan di lebih 2,000 premis runcit seluruh negara di samping penguatkuasaan terhadap pencatutan dan penyeludupan turut dipertingkatkan supaya tekanan global tidak dimanipulasi untuk menaikkan harga secara tidak munasabah.

Akmal Nasrullah berkata kerajaan turut memantau rapi risiko pekerjaan dan setakat ini, prestasi penyertaan tenaga buruh masih stabil walaupun terdapat sedikit peningkatan dalam kadar pengangguran iaitu 2.9 peratus pada April 2026 kepada tiga peratus pada Mei 2026.

Katanya tekanan kepada pasaran buruh bukan hanya berpunca daripada kenaikan harga, tetapi juga daripada permintaan global yang lebih perlahan, kelemahan pasaran eksport dan tekanan kepada operasi perniagaan.

Akmal Nasrullah berkata kerajaan mengambil pendeka-

tan realistik berasaskan bahawa pemulihan krisis bekalan global akan mengambil masa.

Beliau berkata walaupun harga minyak mentah ketika ini telah menyederhana berbanding paras tertinggi sebelum ini, namun kesan kepada kos logistik, bekalan bahan api bertapis, input pertanian dan harga barangan akan mengambil masa untuk kembali stabil.

"Kesimpulannya, kerajaan tidak menafikan bahawa krisis bekalan global membawa risiko besar sekiranya berlautan. Risiko ini sedang diurus secara tersusun, berhemah dan berasaskan data. — Bernama

Govt focuses on essential goods supply, price stability

KUALA LUMPUR: The government is placing special emphasis on safeguarding the supply of essential goods, keeping the prices of basic necessities under control and improving distribution efficiency to ease the impact of rising costs on the people.

Economy Minister Akmal Nasrullah Mohd Nasir said rising logistics and agricultural input costs in the food sector were exerting pressure on consumer goods prices, as 63 per cent of the country's fertiliser needs rely on imported sources.

"Based on current assessments, fertiliser costs are projected to rise by between 15 and 20 per cent, while livestock feed costs are expected to increase by around eight per cent," he said during a ministerial briefing on the global supply crisis in the Dewan Rakyat yesterday.

To ensure stability in supply and prices, Akmal Nasrullah said the government was implementing daily monitoring of the supply and prices of essential goods.

He said coordination had also been made with Petroleum Nasional Berhad (PETRONAS) and industry players to monitor stock levels and implement contingency measures

to ensure consumer needs and the wider economy were not affected while maintaining stability in the country's energy supply.

"The government has so far ensured adequate fuel supply until August 2026 and is working to guarantee continued supply. This is important to ensure that the people's daily activities, public transport, logistics, businesses and critical sectors remain operational," he said.

Akmal Nasrullah said the country's rice supply, including buffer stocks, remained under control and was sufficient for a period of five to six months, while basic food supplies such as chicken, eggs, fish and fruit were adequate for at least one month.

He said that in addition, the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) would continue to monitor 316 essential items at more than 2,000 retail premises nationwide, while enforcement against profiteering and smuggling would also be strengthened to ensure global pressures were not exploited to raise prices unreasonably.

Akmal Nasrullah said the government was also closely monitoring employment

risks, noting that labour force participation had remained stable so far despite a slight increase in the unemployment rate from 2.9 per cent in April 2026 to 3.0 per cent in May 2026.

He said that pressure on the labour market was driven not only by rising prices, but also by slower global demand, weaker export markets and increased pressure on business operations.

Akmal Nasrullah said the government was adopting a realistic approach, taking into account that recovery from the global supply crisis would take time.

He said that while crude oil prices had moderated from previous highs, the effects on logistics costs, refined fuel supplies, agricultural inputs and commodity prices would take time to stabilise.

"In conclusion, the government does not deny that the global supply crisis poses a major risk if it continues. This risk is being managed in an orderly, prudent and data-based manner.

"The crisis will continue to be monitored through the National Economic Action Council (MTEN) and relevant agencies. Information will be shared with the public as needed to ensure clear, accurate and current updates for all parties,"

He added that efforts to address the impact of the crisis required the

cooperation of all parties to lessen its effect on the economy and the people. - BERNAMA

Sibuti berkata demikian ketika menyertai Program Jualan Rahmah MADANI (PJRM) di pasar raya Nam Leong, Senadin, Sabtu lalu.

Pada program itu, Zulhaidah mengedarkan risalah berkaitan Hak Pengguna dan Panduan Keselamatan Mainan Kanak-kanak kepada orang ramai yang hadir membeli-belah.

Katanya, inisiatif tersebut merupakan sebahagian daripada usaha berterusan PKP dalam meningkatkan kesedaran masyarakat mengenai hak pengguna serta kepentingan memilih produk yang selamat dan berkualiti.

"Saya berharap usaha ini dapat memupuk kesedaran dalam kalangan masyarakat mengenai kepentingan memahami hak sebagai pengguna serta memastikan produk yang dibeli, terutama untuk kanak-kanak, memenuhi aspek keselamatan," ujarnya.

經濟部長：燃油可維持至8月 白米庫存足夠半年

（吉隆坡29日讯）经济部长阿柯玛指出，国内燃油供应可维持至8月，白米库存包括缓冲库存也处于受控水平，可应付未来5至6个月的需求。

他今日在下议院发表部长声明时说，鸡肉、鸡蛋、鱼类、牛奶及水果等基本食品供应充足，足

以应付至少一个月的需求。

与此同时，政府将致力确保燃油供应获得保障，以确保人民日常生活、公共交通、物流、商业活动及关键领域不受影响。

他说，政府也会每日监督必需品供应及价格，与国家石油公司及业界协调，监测库存及落实应急措施，确保消费者需求和能源供应保持稳定；同时，国内贸易及生活费部会通过PriceCatcher平台，按地区监督全国逾2000家零售商店共316种必需品价格，并由850名物价监督官员负责执行监督

工作。

他指出，政府加强打击牟取暴利及走私活动，防止有人利用全球供应压力作为借口，不合理抬高物价。

阿柯玛说，全球供应危机的影响预计持续1至2年，政府将加强监督并落实干预措施，以减轻人民、中小微企业及业界所承受的压力。

“政府不会坐等危机结束，而是会采取务实措施应对挑战。”

他说，政府落实国家经济行动理事会提出120项决议中的27

项，以缓解中东局势带来的冲击。

“国家经济行动理事会自3月16日起召开每周会议，并敲定其余93项决议，目前处于落实阶段。”

设专责小组即时干预

他说，政府也成立了危机管理特别工作队，负责监督供应、价格、物流供应链及即时干预需求，同时设立“危机监测仪表盘”。

他指出，根据国际局势发展，能源市场预计将于今年第三季开始逐步趋稳，但这取决于地缘政治局势是否稳定及国际贸易航道能否恢复畅通。

他指出，尽管国际原油价格回落，但物流成本、成品燃料供应、农业投入品及商品价格仍需一段时间才能恢复稳定。（BPK）
