RON97 price gap lures S'pore motorists to Johor

JOHOR BARU: Singaporeans aren't flocking to Johor just for groceries these days – fuel is the "obsession" for the moment.

Petrol prices have spiked sharply in the city state due to the Middle East conflict, with RON95 at almost three times the price in Malaysia at S\$3.41 (RM10.57) per litre.

Singapore vehicles are only allowed to pump the unsubsidised RON97 fuel in Malaysia, which is being retailed here at RM5.15 per litre.

A Singaporean who wanted to be known only as Daryl said that since February, he has been travelling to Johor Baru weekly not just to stock up on household items but also for RON97.

He said RON97 is still cheaper here than RON92 in Singapore, which is being retailed at S\$3.38 (RM10.47) per litre.

"But we have to be careful when doing this as under Singapore law, all exiting vehicles must have their tanks at least three-quarters full. Officials regularly carry out inspections and those caught flouting the rule face a S\$500 (RM1,550) fine and will be ordered to turn back to fill their tanks," he added.

Daryl said he hoped Malaysia would not impose restrictions on the amount of fuel foreign vehicle owners could purchase.

Johor Indian Petty Traders and Small Business Association chairman D. Ravindran said more Singaporeans are expected to shop and fill petrol here under the existing circumstances.

"With what is going on around the world now, we will definitely see more Singaporeans heading here to shop and most importantly, to fill petrol.

"I think petrol will be what they are coming here for now, as evident at our petrol stations," he added.

Echoing the view was Johor Baru Small Businesses Association chairman Tey Tian Hwang, who said the RON97 price difference is significant enough for Singaporeans to cross the Causeway just to pump petrol.

"Johor is just next door, so it is not really a problem for them to drive over to pump petrol as a way of coping with the rising cost of living there," he said.

Tey also did not dismiss the possibility of panic buying involving Singaporeans here, citing the Covid-19 pandemic period.

"It is likely for us to see that again, especially for basic daily essentials and ingredients. We have yet to see panic buying happen, but there are already more Singaporeans crossing over," he added.

Econsave cash and carry general manager Mas Imran Adam also said there has been an increase in the number of Singaporean shoppers in its outlets.

Meanwhile, Bernama reported

that the restriction on RON95 purchases using foreign credit and debit cards at self-service pumps in Malaysia from tomorrow is seen as a move to strengthen the government's fuel subsidy mechanism.

Petrol Dealers Association of Malaysia president Datuk Khairul Annuar Abdul Aziz said the measure complements the ban on RON95 sales to foreign-registered vehicles.

"This reduces reliance on manual monitoring by our workers, what with the manpower constraints," he added.

Pertubuhan Mesra Pengguna Malaysia deputy president Azlin Othman said the payment restriction system must be backed by strict on-ground enforcement.

She cautioned that loopholes might still exist, including the use

of local representatives to carry out transactions.

Federation of Malaysian Consumers Associations president Datuk Dr N. Marimuthu said the measure could mark an early step towards wider subsidy rationalisation.

"The government must ensure public funds reach those who truly qualify," he said.

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry Enforcement director-general Datuk Azman Adam announced last week that purchases of RON95 using foreign credit and debit cards will only be allowed at the counter.

The prolonged Middle East conflict has pushed global crude oil prices up by more than 40%, surpassing US\$100 per barrel and raising concerns over supply disruptions.

PUTRAJAYA (March 30): The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) will implement the installation of closed-circuit television (CCTV) at petrol stations identified as high-risk areas for the misappropriation of subsidised RON95 petrol.

KPDN enforcement director general Datuk Azman Adam said the initiative is aimed at enabling more effective monitoring, as footage would be channelled directly to the KPDN enforcement control centre and state offices.

He said the pilot phase of the CCTV installation is being carried out in stages in collaboration with industry players, particularly in areas identified as 'hotspots', including states bordering neighbouring countries.

"God willing, this year we will begin to adopt this (CCTV) technology more intensively to ensure that issues of leakage and misappropriation can be addressed more effectively," he told *Bernama* recently.

Azman said among the modus operandi used by syndicates to misappropriate subsidised RON95 petrol were repeated purchases at petrol stations and the use of modified

vehicles fitted with additional tanks.

Following this, he said the KPDN is taking steps to closely monitor point-of-sale data and record retail trends at petrol stations.

"If there are anomalies or unusual purchasing patterns that do not match the local demographics, for example, a sudden surge in RON95 purchases at remote stations, the system will trigger a red flag, and auditing and tactical teams will be immediately deployed to the location," he said.

According to Azman, integrated operations are also conducted periodically, particularly in border areas and locations identified as fuel misappropriation hotspots.

"This approach aims to ensure stricter monitoring and close any gaps for syndicates to carry out smuggling activities," he said.

Meanwhile, he said that cases involving the misuse of RON95 petrol recorded a decrease, with 1,300 cases in 2025 compared to 1,713 cases in 2024.

"[The decrease in cases] follows the KPDN's stern warnings and the suspension of licences for petrol station operators found to be complicit, as well as increasing awareness among retailers," he said.

Azman stressed that the KPDN would continue to strengthen enforcement to ensure that subsidised RON95 petrol is enjoyed only by Malaysians and not misused by any party.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim had previously called on all government agencies and machinery to be firmer and more vigilant in enforcing measures to curb any form of RON95 misappropriation.

KPDN addressing fuel supply issues in Niah, Bekenu

MIRI: The Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) here has assured the people of Niah and Bekenu that it is addressing the fuel supply issue, ahead of the purchase adjustment of the Budi Madani RON95 (Budig95) petrol effective tomorrow (April 1).

It was reported that petrol sales at the stations in these two areas were rationed last weekend.

KPDN Miri enforcement chief Englebert Ingath Desmond Japar said the fuel supply in Niah resumed to normal yesterday afternoon after the ministry reached out to oil companies to urgently address the shortage.

The fuel was distributed to the petrol stations in the Niah area at 3.30pm, while for the Bekenu area, the application for

additional Budig95 petrol quota has been referred to Putrajaya for approval while awaiting the new quota, to be distributed on April 1," he told The Borneo Post.

Residents in Bekenu and Niah had expressed deep disappointment when petrol purchases at several stations were limited to RM20 per transaction.

Many returned empty-handed when the supply ran out before they could fill up, triggering them to post their frustrations on social media.

Last week, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim announced that the individual monthly limit for the purchase of Budig95 petrol would be temporarily adjusted to 200 litres per month from 300 litres per month, effective April 1.

However, he also said that the subsidised RON95 price would remain unchanged at RM1.99 per litre.

For diesel, Anwar said Sabah and Sarawak would continue to enjoy a subsidised rate of RM2.15 per litre, despite rising global prices.

Nevertheless, many locals have expressed concern about the adjustment, especially those in the communities still using fuel-powered generator sets.

"RM20 worth of fuel is simply not enough for those still using generator sets," said netizen Denis Aming.

Meanwhile, Bekenu assemblywoman Datuk Rosey Yunus urged the authorities to urgently resolve the fuel supply issue in her constituency.

"I understand that there is a

quota in place, but the KPDN should listen to the people and look into their needs, as this (supply issue) is affecting not only the vehicle owners, but also the fishermen.

"If there's not fuel available, how can they go out to sea?"

Rosey, who is Deputy Minister for Women, Childhood and Community Wellbeing Development, added that the surge in people's movement during the Hari Raya season, tomb-cleaning festival, and the school holidays, as well as demands from small-medium enterprises (SMEs), should also be considered.

"The operators here have to wait until April 1 for new fuel supplies, so what about those going to school and to work, as well as those selling goods?"

KPDN laksana pemasangan CCTV di stesen minyak kekang penyelewengan RON95

PUTRAJAYA: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) akan melaksanakan pemasangan kamera litar tertutup (CCTV) di stesen minyak yang dikenal pasti sebagai kawasan berisiko tinggi berlakunya penyelewengan petrol bersubsidi RON95.

Ketua Pengarah Penguat Kuasa KPDN Datuk Azman Adam berkata inisiatif itu dilaksana bagi membolehkan pemantauan dilakukan secara lebih berkesan memandangkan rakaman akan disalurkan terus ke pusat kawalan penguatkuasaan KPDN dan pejabat negeri.

Beliau berkata fasa rintis pemasangan CCTV itu sedang dilaksanakan secara berperingkat dengan kerjasama pemain industri khususnya di kawasan dikenal pasti sebagai 'hotspot' termasuk di negeri yang bersempadan dengan negara jiran.

"Insya-Allah pada tahun ini, kita akan mula mengguna pakai teknologi (CCTV) ini dengan lebih intensif untuk memastikan isu ketirisan dan penyelewengan dapat

kita atasi dengan lebih baik," katanya kepada Bernama baru-baru ini.

Azman berkata antara modus operandi digunakan sindiket bagi menyeleweng petrol RON95 bersubsidi adalah pembelian berulang di stesen minyak serta penggunaan kenderaan yang diubah suai dengan tangki tambahan.

Susulan itu, beliau berkata KPDN kini mengambil langkah memantau secara rapat data Point of Sale (POS) dan merekod trend peruncitan di stesen-stesen minyak.

"Jika terdapat anomali atau corak pembelian luar biasa yang tidak padan dengan demografi tempatan contohnya lonjakan pembelian RON95 mendadak di stesen yang terpencil, sistem akan mencetuskan amaran dan pasukan pengauditan dan taktikal akan terus digerakkan ke lokasi," katanya.

Azman berkata operasi bersepadu turut dilaksanakan secara berkala khususnya di kawasan sempadan dan lokasi yang dikenal pasti sebagai 'hotspot' penyelewengan bahan api.

"Pendekatan ini bertujuan

memastikan pemantauan lebih ketat dan menutup ruang kepada sindiket untuk menjalankan aktiviti penyelewengan," katanya.

Sementara itu, beliau berkata kes penyalahgunaan petrol RON95 mencatatkan penurunan iaitu 1,713 kes pada 2024 berbanding 1,300 kes pada 2025.

"(Penurunan kes) susulan KPDN memberi amaran keras dan tindakan menggantung lesen pengusaha stesen minyak yang bersekongkol selain kesedaran dalam kalangan peruncit semakin meningkat," katanya.

Azman menegaskan KPDN akan terus memperkukuh penguatkuasaan bagi memastikan petrol bersubsidi RON95 hanya dinikmati rakyat Malaysia dan tidak diseleweng oleh mana-mana pihak.

Sebelum ini, Perdana Menteri Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim menyeru semua agensi serta jentera kerajaan supaya lebih tegas dan berwaspada dalam melaksanakan penguatkuasaan bagi mengekang sebarang bentuk penyelewengan RON 95. — Bernama

System flaws demand structural overhaul

Price disparity and weak oversight expose cracks in subsidy model

KUCHING: The rollout of targeted diesel subsidies in Sarawak, Sabah and Labuan will be implemented in phases, taking into account the regions' unique geography and heavy reliance on diesel for logistics.

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the mechanism for East Malaysia is still being refined, but stressed that curbing leakages from misappropriation and cross-border smuggling remains the key objective.

At present, diesel is priced at RM2.15 per litre in Sarawak and Sabah, significantly lower than RM5.52 per litre in Peninsular Malaysia — a disparity that has raised concerns over the sustainability of the subsidy system.

From an industry perspective, Johor Transport & Logistics Operators' Association (JoTran) president Frankie Chia Jee Onn told Sarawak Tribune that the widening price gap has fuelled increasingly aggressive smuggling activities, driven by the high cost of non-subsidised industrial fuel.

"This issue is at a worrying level as it creates an unbalanced business environment," he said, adding that compliant operators are facing unfair competition.

According to Chia, black market operators are able to undercut freight rates as their fuel costs fall outside regulated pricing and subsidy mechanisms.

He added that such activities have also led to supply disruptions at petrol stations, affecting logistics firms' ability to meet delivery schedules.

Chia pointed to several systemic weaknesses that enable diesel leakages, including poor data

integration among enforcement agencies such as the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN), Customs and the police, which limits early detection.

He also highlighted flaws in the quota system, noting that flat-rate subsidies are not aligned with actual usage, such as mileage and load factors, while the lack of real-time identity verification for subsidy cards increases the risk of misuse.

While welcoming the Subsidised Diesel Control System (SDCS) as a step forward, he stressed that its implementation must be seamless

to avoid creating cash flow pressures for small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

"As long as there is a large price gap, smuggling will persist. The illegal margins are simply too attractive," he said.

To address the issue, Chia proposed greater digitalisation, including the use of telematics or GPS tracking on industrial tanks and tankers to monitor fuel movement in real time.

He also called for subsidy allocations to be based on operational profiles rather than fixed quotas.

While enforcement actions such as raids and roadblocks remain necessary, Chia said they are insufficient on their own.

"We need structural reforms. Without integrated monitoring systems and smart data, smugglers will continue to find ways around enforcement," he said, adding that stricter penalties across the supply chain are needed to serve as an effective deterrent.

他指出，有鉴于此，内贸部如今采取密切监控销售点（POS）数据的方式，并记录各油站的零售趋势。

“一旦发现异常情况或与本地人口结构不符的购买模式，例如偏远地区油站的

RON95销量突然激增，系统将触发警示，届时审计及执法小组将立即赶往现场。”

他提到，有关当局也将定期展开综合行动，尤其是在边境地区，以及被鉴定为滥用燃油的热点地区。

“这方法旨在确保更严密的监控，并堵住不法集团进行走私活动的空间。”

Harga ayam segar mungkin naik

- FLFAM tidak jamin harga sekarang akan terus kekal
- Kenaikan bergantung kepada bekalan, kos semasa

MELAKA – Persekutuan Persatuan-persatuan Penternak Malaysia (FLFAM) tidak menafikan kemungkinan harga ayam akan meningkat susulan kenaikan harga minyak diesel, namun masa sebenar kenaikan itu masih belum dapat dipastikan.

Penasihatnya, Datuk Jeffrey Ng berkata, setakat ini harga ayam di Melaka masih kekal pada paras biasa dan tidak terjejas kerana negara masih menggunakan bekalan sedia ada.

"Buat masa ini harga ayam masih stabil dan murah, namun kenaikan tetap akan berlaku disebabkan peningkatan kos terutama diesel yang ketara.

"Bila kenaikan itu akan berlaku, kami tidak dapat pastikan lagi kerana bergantung kepada

keadaan bekalan dan kos semasa," katanya ketika dihubungi semalam.

Menurutnya, sekiranya ber-

laku kenaikan, pihaknya akan berbincang dengan kerajaan bagi merangka mekanisme sesuai supaya tidak membebankan rakyat.

"Perbincangan akan dibuat untuk mencari kaedah terbaik mengimbangi kos dan pada masa sama tidak menekan pengguna.

"Saya juga menggalakkan masyarakat menjadi pengguna bijak dengan membandingkan harga dan memilih peniaga yang menawarkan harga lebih rendah," ujarnya.

Tambah beliau, Kementerian Ekonomi turut meminta FLFAM menyediakan laporan berhubung impak kenaikan harga diesel terhadap harga ayam dan telur.

Katanya, permintaan ayam di Semenanjung Malaysia ketika ini mencecah kira-kira 2.2 juta ekor sehari.

Sementara itu, tinjauan Kosmo! di Pasar Besar Melaka mendapati, ayam bersih dijual sekitar RM8.50 hingga RM10 sekilogram.

Seorang peniaga, Hamzah Othman, 62, berkata, harga tersebut kekal sejak awal Januari lalu termasuk sepanjang musim perayaan Tahun Baharu Cina lalu dan Aidilfitri.

"Setakat ini harga memang tak berubah lagi, masih sama sejak awal tahun walaupun kos lain ada naik," katanya.

Tinjauan di beberapa pasar raya pula mendapati harga ayam dijual lebih rendah, iaitu serendah RM6.29 sekilogram.

Cubaan seludup minyak masak bersubsidi tumpas

PPM tahan sebuah lori bersama seorang lelaki tempatan yang dipercayai pemandu di Lahad Datu

LAHAD DATU: Cubaan menyeludup minyak masak bersubsidi menggunakan sebuah lori gagal apabila dikesan Pasukan Polis Marin (PPM) dalam serbuan di Kampung Atiam, di sini, petang Ahad.

Dalam kejadian kira-kira jam 3.10 petang itu, sebuah lori ditahan bersama seorang lelaki tempatan berusia 61 tahun yang dipercayai pemandu kenderaan berkenaan.

Komander PPM Wilayah 4 Sabah, Asisten Komisioner Amri Abdul Rahman berkata, pemeriksaan ke atas lori yang ditutup dengan kain kanvas menemukan beberapa bungkusan plastik hitam

mencurigakan.

Katanya, pemeriksaan lanjut membawa kepada penemuan minyak masak bersubsidi yang disorok di dalam bungkusan berkenaan.

"Setiap kotak mengandungi 17 pekot dan keseluruhan rampasan adalah sebanyak 64 kotak bersamaan 1,088 pekot minyak masak," katanya ketika dihubungi, semalam.

Beliau berkata, pemandu lori terbabit gagal menunjukkan sebarang dokumen atau permit sah daripada Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) bagi membawa serta menyimpan bekalan berkenaan.

"Kes disiasat mengikut Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961

dan jumlah keseluruhan rampasan dianggarkan bernilai RM42,790," katanya.

Amri berkata, pihaknya akan terus mempergiatkan operasi membanteras kegiatan penyelewengan barangan bersubsidi bagi memastikan bekalan sampai kepada golongan sasaran.

"PPM komited menjalankan pemantauan dan tindakan tegas terhadap mana-mana pihak yang cuba mengambil kesempatan demi kepentingan sendiri," katanya.

Marine Police seize lorry carrying subsidised cooking oil

LAHAD DATU: The Lahad Datu Marine Police foiled an attempt to smuggle subsidised cooking oil after detaining a lorry in Kampung Atiam here on Sunday afternoon.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of marine police personnel conducted a raid at the location around 3.10 pm. During the operation, an Isuzu rigid lorry driven by a 61-year-old local man was stopped for inspection.

Checks on the lorry's cargo, which was concealed under canvas sheeting, revealed several black plastic packages. Further inspection found that the packages contained boxes of "Cap Mawar" brand subsidised cooking oil.

Each box contained 17 packets

of cooking oil, bringing the total seizure to 64 boxes, equivalent to 1,088 packets of subsidised cooking oil.

The lorry driver failed to produce any documents or permits from the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) authorising the transport and storage of the controlled items.

The case is being investigated under the Control of Supplies Act 1961. The total value of the seizure is estimated at RM42,790.

The Marine Police reiterated its commitment to combating any form of subsidy leakage to safeguard the interests of the people and the nation. – **James Leong**

Diesel untuk pasaran gelap bernilai RM3 juta dirampas

BINTULU: Pihak penguat kuasa Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) Cawangan Bintulu melancarkan operasi bersepadu bersama pihak PDRM bermula pertengahan Mac telah menumpaskan sindiket-sindiket diesel di sekitar bahagian Bintulu.

Menurut Ketua Cawangan Pejabat KPDN Bintulu Al Redzamani Abdul Razak dalam kenyataannya semalam, hasil operasi selama dua minggu tersebut telah menghasilkan jumlah sitaan hampir RM3 juta, rampasan terbesar setakat ini.

"Operasi ini juga adalah hasil risikan pihak Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM), selain bantuan anggota polis," ujarinya.

Serbuan yang dijalankan katanya, melibatkan beberapa stor haram yang digunakan oleh sindiket sebagai tempat transit minyak diesel bersubsidi sebelum dijual ke pasaran gelap.

Selain minyak diesel kata Al Redzamani, turut disita dalam serbuan tersebut adalah sebuah lori tangki, sebuah kapal tangki, beberapa tangki 'skid' dan IBC serta beberapa kenderaan pacuan empat roda yang digunakan oleh sindiket.

Menurutnya, kertas siasatan akan dibuka yang mana kes itu akan disiasat di bawah Akta Kawalan Bekalan 1961 dan Peraturan-Peraturan Kawalan Bekalan 1974.

Jika sabit kesalahan katanya, suspek boleh dikenakan hukuman denda maksimum RM1 juta atau penjara sehingga tiga tahun atau keduanya sekali.

"Pihak KPDN Bintulu menerima banyak aduan berhubung sindiket minyak

diesel menerusi pelbagai medium termasuk aduan tular, media sosial KPDN, e-aduan, WhatsApp dan panggilan telefon," ujarinya.

Selain itu katanya, isu kekurangan minyak diesel kerap dibuat aduan oleh orang awam termasuk orang kenamaan sebelum ini.

內貿局與警方“聯合執法行動” 搗破多個柴油走私集團

(民都魯30日訊) 國內貿易及生活成本部民都魯分局自今年3月中旬起，聯合警方展開“聯合執法行動”，成功搗破活躍于民都魯省一帶的多個柴油走私集團。

為期兩周的行動共取得重大成果，累計查獲物品總值接近 300 萬令吉，為迄今最大規模的一次起獲行動。

國內貿易及生活成本部 (KPDN) 民都魯分局主任納查理表示，此次行動亦是基于警方的情報掌握，並獲得警方人員的全面配合與支援。

突擊多個非法儲存據點

“執法單位在行動中突擊多個非法儲存據點，這些地點被懷疑作為補貼柴油的中轉站，在轉售至黑市前進行囤積與分配。”

納查理在文告提到，除了補貼柴油外，當局也查扣多項相關設備與交通工具，包括一輛油槽羅里、一艘油槽船、多個儲油槽及數輛涉案的車輛。

當局已針對此案開檔調查，並援引《1961 年供應管制法令》及《1974 年供應管制條例》展開調查。一旦罪成，涉案者可被判處最高 100 萬令吉罰款或最長 3 年監禁，或兩者兼施。

近期接大量投訴

納查理披露，近期大量有關柴油走私的投訴，包括社交媒體、電子投訴系統、WhatsApp 及電話舉報。同時，社會大眾包括部分知名人士也曾反映柴油供應短缺問題。

“這一情況與全球油價上漲密切相關，尤其是西亞地區戰爭引發的國際油價波動，使得不法集團趁機操縱補貼柴油，從加油站轉售至黑市以牟取暴利。”

“為應對相關問題，民都魯分局已採取多項主動措施，除聯合警方、海事執法機構及水警展開行動外，也對區內所有加油站進行每日監督與持續檢查，包括審查營業記錄簿與庫存記錄及調閱閉路電視 (CCTV) 畫面，以確保業者嚴格遵守相關法律。”

當局強調，任何被發現與柴油走私集團勾結的單位或個人，將

面對嚴厲執法，包括吊銷或撤銷營業執照等後果。
