KPDN rampas bahan berkaitan petroleum RM23.1j

Marang: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) sudah merampas bahan berkaitan petroleum bernilai RM23.1 juta melalui Ops Tiris 4.0 (Bersepadu).

Ketua Pengarah Penguat Kuasa KPDN, Datuk Azman Adam, berkata sehingga kelmarin sebanyak 42,894 pemeriksaan dijalankan dengan 556 tindakan kes direkodkan membabitkan barang kawalan seperti diesel, petrol dan Gas Petroleum Cecair (LPG).

Daripada jumlah itu, katanya, seramai 161 individu ditahan, manakala nilai rampasan keseluruhan dianggarkan RM23.1 juta.

Katanya, daripada keseluruhan 556 kes yang direkodkan, penyelewengan membabitkan bahan api diesel dan petrol mencatatkan jumlah tertinggi, masing-masing 249 kes bagi diesel dan 119 kes bagi petrol.

“Operasi ini membuktikan keberkesanan kerjasama di antara agensi, dengan KPDN menerajui sektor daratan, mana-

kala Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) dan Agensi Penguatkuasaan Maritim Malaysia (Maritim Malaysia) mengemu-

di sektor sempadan serta perairan.

“Sepanjang pelaksanaan Ops Tiris 4.0 (Bersepadu), sebanyak 242 kes serahan direkodkan oleh pelbagai agensi penguat kuasa daripada keseluruhan 556 kes,” katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian pada sidang media selepas merasmikan Sambutan Hari Penguat Kuasa KPDN Ke-54 Peringkat Negeri Terengganu, di sini, semalam.

Mengulas mengenai ketirisan, Azman berkata, negeri yang paling banyak mencatatkan kes berkaitan dengan diesel ialah Sarawak, iaitu 91 kes diikuti Sabah dan Johor.

“Untuk petrol, negeri yang paling banyak kes ialah Kelantan, diikuti oleh Sabah.

“Bagi LPG pula negeri yang paling banyak ialah Sabah, diikuti Kedah. Hampir semua negeri yang mencatatkan rekod kes yang tertinggi ialah negeri

di sempadan,” katanya.

Beliau berkata, Pasukan Gerakan Am (PGA) mencatatkan jumlah serahan tertinggi iaitu 132 kes, diikuti Pasukan Polis Marin (PPM) dengan 67 kes dan Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) sebanyak 33 kes.

Beliau berkata, sepanjang tempoh pelaksanaan Ops Tiris 4.0 (Bersepadu) sehingga kelmarin, KPDN Terengganu melaksanakan 1,433 pemeriksaan dengan 11 tindakan kes direkodkan.

“Daripada jumlah kes itu, diesel mencatatkan jumlah kes tertinggi iaitu sebanyak empat kes, diikuti LPG sebanyak tiga kes, manakala minyak masak dan gula masing-masing merekodkan dua kes,” katanya.

Beliau berkata, dalam operasi di Terengganu ini turut membabitkan rampasan keseluruhan bernilai RM211,341.

Ketua Pengarah Penguatkuasa Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Azman Adam berkata, sepanjang tempoh operasi itu, sebanyak 42,894 pemeriksaan dijalankan melibatkan pelbagai premis dan lokasi strategik di seluruh negara.

Beliau berkata, daripada jumlah tersebut, sebanyak 556 kes direkodkan membabitkan penyelewengan barangan kawalan seperti diesel, petrol dan gas petroleum cecair (LPG).

KPDN berjaya sita RM23 juta barangan kawalan diseleweng

MARANG – Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri (KPDN) dan Kos Sara Hidup berjaya mematahkan 556 aktiviti percubaan menyeleweng barangan kawalan dalam tempoh kurang dua bulan pelaksanaan Ops Tiris 4.0 sejak 16 Mac lalu.

Ketua Pengarah Penguat Kuasa KPDN, Datuk Azman Adam berkata, nilai rampasan barangan kawalan sepanjang pelaksanaan operasi tersebut sehingga kelmarin sudah melebihi RM23.17 juta.

Beliau berkata, tiga barangan kawalan utama yang paling banyak dikesan cuba diseleweng dalam Ops Tiris 4.0 ialah diesel dan petrol dan minyak masak.

"Lebih 66 peratus kes (penyelewengan) dilaporkan melibatkan diesel (249 kes) dan petrol (119 kes).

"Kebanyakan kes tersebut dilaporkan di negeri-negeri terletak bersempadan dengan negara jiran seperti Sarawak, Sabah, Kelantan, Johor dan Kedah," katanya di Wakaf Tapai di

sini semalam.

Terdahulu beliau ditemui selepas merasmikan sambutan Hari Penguat Kuasa KPDN ke-54 peringkat Terengganu.

Azman berkata, setakat ini, Ops Tiris 4.0 mendapati, kebanyakan kes penyelewengan diesel dilaporkan di Sarawak, Sabah dan Johor.

Beliau berkata, aktiviti penyelewengan petrol pula banyak dikesan di Kelantan dan Sabah.

"Aktiviti penyelewengan LPG (gas petroleum cecair) pula banyak berjaya dipatahkan di Sabah dan Kedah.

Ketua Pengarah Penguat Kuasa Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN), Datuk Azman Adam berkata, statistik tersebut melibatkan 42,894 pemeriksaan di pelbagai premis serta lokasi strategik.

Menurut beliau, daripada jumlah pemeriksaan itu, sebanyak 556 kes melibatkan penyelewengan diesel, petrol dan gas petroleum cecair (LPG) telah direkodkan.

Diesel and petrol-related offences top Ops Tiris 4.0 list

MARANG: A total of 42,894 inspections were conducted under Ops Tiris 4.0, resulting in 556 cases involving controlled goods such as diesel, petrol and liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), says Datuk Azman Adam.

The Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry's (KPDN) enforcement director-general said the cases were detected after operations began on March 16 and, as of Friday, had resulted in 161 arrests and seizures estimated at RM23.17mil.

Of the total cases, diesel-related offences accounted for the highest number at 249, followed by petrol with 119 cases, he added.

"Overall, Sarawak recorded the highest number of diesel-related

cases, followed by Sabah and Johor.

"For petrol-related offences, Kelantan recorded the most cases, followed by Sabah," Azman told reporters after the state-level 54th Enforcement Day celebration here yesterday.

He said Sabah recorded the highest number of LPG-related cases, followed by Kedah.

"This shows that Sabah remains among the states with the highest number of offences involving controlled goods," Azman said in a report by Bernama.

Azman said KPDN is strengthening cooperation with various ministries and enforcement agencies, while enhancing intelligence-sharing efforts to tackle smug-

gling and leakage activities more effectively.

He said Ops Tiris 4.0 demonstrated the effectiveness of strategic inter-agency cooperation, with KPDN leading enforcement operations on land, while the police and the Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency coordinated operations at borders and in territorial waters.

Of the total 556 cases, Azman said, 242 cases were conducted by the various enforcement agencies.

"The General Operations Force recorded the highest number of cases with 132, followed by the Marine Police with 67 cases and the police with 33 cases."

Meanwhile, Azman said

Terengganu KPDN continued to show encouraging performance in regulating the local market, noting that 1,433 inspections were carried out in the state, resulting in 11 cases.

"Diesel-related offences recorded the highest number of cases with four, followed by LPG with three cases, while cooking oil and sugar each recorded two cases.

"The operation also involved seizures worth RM211,341.10."

Azman urged the public to support the Kita Gempur initiative to curb manipulation and leakages by acting as the government's "eyes and ears" and reporting suspicious activities involving smuggling, misappropriation and leakage of controlled goods.

"Dua lelaki terbabit kemudian diserahkan kepada KPDN Kubang Pasu untuk proses rakaman percakapan dan dokumentasi bagi pembukaan dua kertas siasatan. Mereka telah dijamin polis di Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah Kubang Pasu," ujarnya.

Menurutnya, pengguna berkenaan yang menunggang

motosikal kehabisan minyak dan kemudian membawa tong gelen kosong ke sebuah stesen minyak berhampiran.

Namun katanya, permintaan itu ditolak oleh kakitangan stesen minyak berkenaan kerana bimbang melanggar peraturan dan dikenakan tindakan.

Susulan itu, Lee pergi ke

stesen minyak berkenaan bagi mendapatkan penjelasan mengenainya.

"Hasil maklum balas yang diterima mendapati Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) tidak melarang sepenuhnya pembelian petrol menggunakan bekas, sebaliknya penggu-

naan bekas yang selamat dan sesuai amat dititikberatkan," katanya.

Menurutnya, pihak stesen minyak menjelaskan bahawa pembelian petrol hanya dibenarkan menggunakan bekas yang selamat, tertutup dan berkualiti bagi mengelakkan risiko kebocoran serta kebakaran.

Fuel price, WFH threaten F&B hawkers, MSME ecosystem



Higher transport and energy costs are inflating expenses, forcing many small operators to raise prices, cut portions or absorb losses

The drop in fuel price, driven by geopolitical tensions in West

Asia, is intensifying cost pressures across Malaysia's food and beverage (F&B) sector, particularly among hawkers, micro-entrepreneurs and small food operators.

The Federation of Malaysian Industries and Traders Associations warned that fuel prices could increase by as much as 50% due to the conflict attributed to higher transport costs for raw materials and goods.

The Federation is March said that traders were already reducing purchase volumes amid weaker demand, exacerbating their loss.

Small hawkers and consumers will bear the brunt as businesses raise prices to stay afloat.

Similarly, M&A Corp Malaysia cautioned that fuel costs for motor, small and medium enterprises (SMEs) could rise from 4% to as much as 50% depending on the extent of price escalation, driven by global oil prices exceeding US\$100 (RM70) per barrel.

Blowing Fuel Costs Push Hawkers Towards Closure
The Small and Medium Enterprises Association of Malaysia (SAMSE)

warned that escalating fuel and energy costs are pushing hawkers' MSMEs, especially hawkers, at risk of closure.

National president Dairik Williams said that fuel costs for motor, small and medium enterprises (SMEs) could rise from 4% to as much as 50% depending on the extent of price escalation, driven by global oil prices exceeding US\$100 (RM70) per barrel.

"We are seeing a dangerous trend where margins are so thin that even minor additional spike in the price of cooking gas or

transport could push these operators past the business threshold, as they lack the financial resources to absorb prolonged losses," he told *The Malaysian Reserve* (TMR).

As of May 5, oil is trading at RM16.50 per barrel, driving up the cost of ingredients, packaging and delivery.

With 6% of Malaysia's crude imports passing through the national bank of Indonesia, logistics players have begun adding surcharges, resulting in immediate cost pressures across the food supply chain.

Small SMEs, particularly food operators, are struggling to pass on rising costs to consumers spending less, with about 35% already reporting softer demand. Price increases often lead to an immediate drop in customers, forcing traders to absorb costs, reduce margins or cut portions at the risk of being customer hostile.

At the same time, rising input costs and slower delivery cycles are straining working capital and widening cashflow gaps.

Ng noted that 70% of SMEs surveyed by Samara have very limited reserves and that they are struggling to pay for the cost of raw materials while waiting for daily sales to turn in.

"This is why Samara is pushing for 'no-hold' store approval of 'Credit Limit' and a reduction in debt service maturity ratio (DSR) thresholds to one time to allow these businesses to access the additional financing they need to stay afloat," he said.

input, and we are seeing a combined effect that has caused our cost of doing business to rise significantly," he said.

"Resilience is lower now because many SMEs have already reduced the volume and are saving production on fuel while margins are being crushed by steep inflation," he said.

Digital platforms, since a 10% fuel tax during the pandemic, are now contributing to cost pressures through commission fees of 20% to 30%.

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Current Association (Pusat) president, Dairik Mohammad Amin, Abdul Razak reportedly said that reduced fuel cost has been partly cushioned by delivery demand, but overall effects remain significant.

Meanwhile, according to a Malaysian e-tailing Coalition (SEM) survey among about 30 retailers, delivery volumes have risen by only 10% to 15%, compared to up to 10% for parcel delivery.

SEM deputy president Mohd Shams said the sector is facing new challenges in rising fuel costs combined with declining rider earnings.

"The said, the main issue now is that operating costs have risen sharply while delivery volumes have fallen by more than 50%, leading many riders to quit. The sector needs to be more sustainable in the long term," he said.

Although the government has increased fuel quotas for e-hailing drivers under the Road User Levy (RUL) scheme to 100 km, delivery riders receive only 10% bonus monthly.

"As a result, operating costs for e-hailing delivery services have risen sharply, and for some riders and drivers — especially those in the rural areas — it's not sustainable," he said.

The motorcycle riders, if operating costs continue to rise to unsustainable levels, this will significantly affect the overall delivery ecosystem unless there is strong intervention and price subsidies from relevant stakeholders," he added.

Mohd Shams warned that riders, drivers and consumers bear the greatest risk in the ecosystem, while platform owners are relatively protected.

"SEM has therefore proposed a regulatory framework to help reduce the burden on riders, drivers and consumers, including setting a maximum commission cap of 10% for riders and drivers, to ensure that the burden falls on the platform owners and not on the riders and drivers," he said.

As cost pressures apply through every layer of the food ecosystem, food operators and logistics to last-mile delivery, industry players are warned that the sector requires more targeted intervention.

While short-term relief may help ease immediate strain, the convergence of high fuel prices, shifting consumer behaviour and structural cost challenges threaten the need for deeper reforms.

Without strategic policy support and a faster transition towards more resilient energy and supply chain models, Malaysia's hawker and MSME ecosystem risk prolonged contraction.

For many small operators already operating on thin margins, cost-cutting measures will be critical in determining whether they can adapt or be forced to exit an increasingly challenging market.

E-commerce groups urge review of WHT, digital tax laws

SEVERAL e-commerce associations are urging the government to review the implementation of Withholding Tax (WHT) and reform Malaysia's digital taxation framework, warning that the current structure is burdening online sellers and affecting the growth of the digital economy.

Malaysian Cyber Consumer Association (MCCA) president Siraj Jalil proposed a convention or roundtable involving ministries, regulators, platform providers and industry players to discuss a collective solution to issues affecting the e-commerce ecosystem.

"We urge for a roundtable involving all stakeholders because what we want is attention and immediate action from the authorities," he said at a joint press conference on May 6.

Industry players claim online sellers are facing mounting operating costs due to the combination of Sales and Service Tax (SST),

WHT and platform fees imposed by foreign digital platforms.

Malaysia's eCommerce Entrepreneurs Association (PUEDM) president Syed Gaddafi Syed Saifuddin said sellers are effectively subjected to "double taxation" when adver-

tising on platforms such as Meta Platforms Inc and TikTok.

"On top of the 8% SST that we already pay, we are forced to pay another 10% WHT, making the cost RM118,000 for a RM100,000 advertisement," he said.

The associations also argued that Malaysia's digital tax structure is less business-friendly compared to countries such as Singapore and Indonesia, which they said offer more flexible mechanisms for digital businesses.

Meanwhile, Malay Chamber of Commerce Malaysia (DPMM) president Norsyahrin Hamidon proposed that small and medium enterprises (SMEs) with annual revenue below RM5 million be exempted from WHT to reduce the burden on smaller businesses.

The groups added that local businesses are struggling to compete with cross-border sellers, particularly from China, and called for a "level playing field" to ensure fair competition for Malaysian online sellers.

Industry representatives also claimed policymakers do not fully understand the operational realities faced by digital entrepreneurs when introducing tax and e-commerce policies.

The associations said an engagement session had already been held with the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) and more discussions involving e-commerce platform providers are expected to take place soon.
