Govt targets fleet card abuse

KOTA KINABALU:

The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) is drafting a proposed specific legal provisions under the Supply Control Act 1961 to tighten regulations of fleet card usage in relation to the distribution of fuel subsidies through the Subsidised Diesel Control Scheme (SKDS) and the Subsidised Petrol Control Scheme (SKPS).



KPDN Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali (pic) said such move aims to establish a clearer, more comprehensive and well-organised for the implementation, regulation and enforcement of fleet card usage in a stricter and more effective manner.

He said the new regulations would cover the responsibilities of fleet card holders and oil companies which issue the fleet cards, while also detailing offences and penalties for any form of subsidy abuse by misusing the fleet cards.

"The government is committed to ensuring that diesel and petrol subsidies reach only the eligible groups and sectors, while closing any loopholes that could be manipulated by irresponsible parties.

"As such, KPDN is currently drafting the proposed specific regulations under the Supply Control, following detection of several modus operandi involving leakages and misappropriation of subsidised diesel and petrol through the misuse of fleet cards.

"From 2023 until May 14, 2026, a total of 223 fleet cards under the implementation of SKDS and SKPS had been blocked after being detected involved in suspicious activities and violations of misusing the fleet card usage," Armizan said.

He said this in a press conference that was held in conjunction with the 'Kita Beli Barangan Malaysia (KBBM)' programme, officiated by Chief Minister Datuk Seri Hajiji Haji Noor, at Sabah International Convention Centre here on Saturday.

To a question, Armizan said among the main offences identified from the 223 blocked fleet cards, was the use of subsidised diesel purchased through fleet cards by vehicles that were not registered under the respective fleet cards.

"Such abuse of the fleet card is clearly an offence because each fleet card is registered not only under the name of the eligible company in the goods transportation or public land transport sector, but is also specifically tied to particular vehicles from 23 categories of vehicles.

"There were also cases that we

detected, such as one in Johor recently, where our enforcement officers uncovered premises being used to store diesel collected in small quantities. The diesel was kept in large containers at the premises for certain purposes and for sale to industries by imposing non-subsidised pricing.

"We found three fleet cards at the concerned premises which indicates that one of the modus operandi involving fleet cards is purchasing small amounts of diesel repeatedly and then accumulating it at such premises.

"So, in certain cases, we immediately blocked the fleet cards involved. That is why it is important for us, at this stage, not only to impose restrictions or block the fleet cards but to introduce specific regulations that are clearer and more comprehensive to act as deterrent against these violations and act of misusing the fleet cards," he said.

According to Armizan, KPDN has already prepared the draft regulations and need to go through several processes, including engagement sessions with stakeholders.

"It must also go through the Regulatory Impact Analysis (RIA) process, as well as, most importantly, engagement with the Attorney General's Chambers.

"Only then can I bring the matter to the Federal Cabinet before the regulations are gazetted and enforced.

"However, at the KPDN level, we are already prepared with the draft, and we are aiming to complete all these processes as quickly as possible so that the regulations can be enforced immediately," he said.

Previously, Armizan said the SKDS fleet card system for the Goods Transportation Sector was only implemented in Peninsular Malaysia, and he is confident that with registration now opened to Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan, its usage will increase significantly.

"As such, the need to establish specific legislation through dedicated regulations under the Supply Control Act 1961 is extremely important and must be expedited to deter misappropriation of the fuel subsidies," he said.

Armizan said KPDN will continue strengthening monitoring and enforcement at the ground level, and any party found misusing fleet cards for the misappropriation of diesel and petrol subsidies will face stern action.

He said the government will not compromise with any party attempting to take advantage of the subsidy system created to assist eligible rakyat and economic sectors.

He also issued a stern reminder that the government would continue ensuring subsidies are channelled only to those genuinely eligible, while safeguarding the interests of the rakyat and the nation's finances.

Online demand for Sabah products up

KOTA KINABALU: Local small entrepreneurs at the Inspirasi Beli Barangan Malaysia programme said government-organised trade events have helped boost their sales and widen their reach, with some Sabah products now finding buyers as far as Australia.

Eddy Abdul, a small local entrepreneur who owns a hand-woven Siga business based in Kota Belud, said the programme helped him reach customers far from his home base.

"Normally I operate in Kota Belud, but when I come to Kota Kinabalu with wider marketing exposure, it helps me expand my market," he said when met at his stall.

Eddy was among small local entrepreneurs invited to participate in the programme hosted by the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry at the Sabah International Convention Centre.

The opening ceremony was officiated by Chief Minister Datuk Seri Hajiji Noor. Eddy said he received orders for his product from as far as Australia after buyers spotted the event online.

"People working there saw this activity, contacted me and asked me to ship Siga there," he said.

He said the business was rooted in his family's heritage. His mother had been weaving and making Siga since he was around 15 years old, a tradition now spanning roughly 25 years.

"Even though I am not fortunate enough to work with any government department, I took the opportunity from what my mother was doing and made it my full-time job," he said.

"It has helped my own economy. I am not tied to any employer and I can manage my life without too much pressure," he said, adding that about 85 per cent of the

materials used in his products are sourced from other local Sabahan suppliers.

Small local entrepreneur, Mohd Ali, owner of Lados, a local sambal and condiment brand, said the support from the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry had made a real difference.

"The Ministry has opened many opportunities for us and boosted our sales," he said, adding that their Tuhau product has become a trend.

"Visitors to Sabah, especially those from the Peninsula, now make it a souvenir," he said.

He said this was not the first time he had been invited to take part in government-organised events, pointing out that he had previously joined the Karnival Beli Barangan Malaysia in Ranau, Kuching and Pahang, where all his products sold out.

"We brought many items to Kuching expecting that whatever did not sell, we would give to agents. But everything sold out," he said.

He added that besides the Ministry, other agencies including Fama under the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, as well as Sabah's Department of Industrial Development and Research (DIDR) and the State Industrial Development, Entrepreneurship and Transport Ministry have been very supportive.

"The Sabah Economic Development Corporation assisted us with our brand's halal certification and grants, while the Malaysian Agricultural Research and Development Institute conducted shelf-life testing for our Lados products," he said.

He said Tuhau, their brand's best-sell-

ing product, was once produced solely for the Sabah market but had since attracted fans across Sarawak and Peninsular Malaysia, particularly after the company participated in the Malaysia Agriculture, Horticulture and Agrotourism exhibition.

Another local small entrepreneur, Siti Faerah, who owns Fera Crafty, said the programme reflects a personal milestone for her business.

"This is the first time I have my own booth under my own name. I feel the programme really helped," she said.

She started her handicraft business in 2020 during the pandemic and said consistent demand had kept her going.

"If sales were not going well, I would have stopped from the beginning," she said. "Now with the government's target of bringing in millions of tourists, handi-

crafts definitely have more potential to grow and bring more income for entrepreneurs like us," she added.

She noted that free booth space provided at events like this was a relief for small entrepreneurs, as rental fees at established venues were steep.

"I hope the government can give more opportunities for small entrepreneurs like us to sell at events like this," she said, adding that she had been self-funding her packaging costs and had not yet applied for assistance from agencies such as DIDR.

Her products, which include hand-made resin crafts, beaded accessories and handcrafted watches decorated with traditional beads, are currently sold within Sabah, with materials sourced locally from Kota Kinabalu and Kudat, and some from Sarawak.

Dua lelaki seleweng 1,207kg minyak masak bersubsidi ditahan

Pasir Mas: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) Kelantan menahan dua lelaki serta merampas 1,207 kilogram (kg) minyak masak bersubsidi di Banggol Chicha, dekat Pasir Mas, malam kelmarin.

Dalam Ops Tiris 4.0 (Bersepadu), pada jam 10 malam itu, dua lelaki berusia 22 dan 27 tahun ditahan.

Timbalan Pengarah KPDN Kelantan, Aswadi Jaafar, berkata operasi dijalankan sepasukan pegawai penguat kuasa KPDN dengan kerjasama Pasukan Polis Marin Wilayah 3, Pengkalan Ku-

bor selepas menerima maklumat mengenai sebuah kereta Perodua Alza disyaki digunakan untuk aktiviti penyelewengan dan penyeludupan minyak masak bersubsidi ke negara jiran.

Katanya, pegawai serbuan kemudian mengekori kenderaan terbabit dari Bulatan Lemal menghala ke Rantau Panjang sebelum pemandunya memandu secara melulu dan berbahaya sebaik menyedari kehadiran pihak berkuasa.

"Kenderaan itu akhirnya berjaya ditahan di hadapan sebuah rumah dan pemeriksaan lanjut

menemukan sejumlah minyak masak pekot satu kilogram disimpan di bahagian tempat duduk belakang serta bonet kenderaan.

"Hasil pemeriksaan menemukan sebanyak 1,207kg minyak masak bersubsidi kemudian disita bersama sebuah Perodua Alza.

Checks on diesel compliance off Labuan

LABUAN: The Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) Labuan branch continues to strengthen the implementation of Ops Tiris 4.0 (Integrated) through comprehensive inspections and monitoring covering both land and surrounding waters off Labuan.

Chief Enforcement Officer Amiluddin Malang said an enforcement team was deployed to conduct routine inspections on bunkering vessels in Labuan waters.

He said the inspections were aimed at ensuring activities involving the storage, transfer and usage of diesel and other controlled goods complied with existing laws and regulations.

"The inspections are also intended to curb any form of leakage, misappropriation and abuse of subsidised controlled goods, including unauthorised transfers, suspicious storage activities and smuggling that could affect supply and market stability," he said.

Ops Tiris 4.0 (Integrated) is being carried out continuously through strategic cooperation with other enforcement agencies to strengthen control over the subsidised diesel distribution chain and ensure government subsidies reach only eligible groups and sectors.

Amiluddin added that another enforcement team also conducted compliance inspections at petrol stations and retail premises around Labuan involving domestic trade laws, including price tagging compliance, the use of weighing and measuring instruments, supply of essential goods and other regulations enforced by KPDN.

Overall inspection results found that the level of compliance among traders was good and no enforcement action was taken. No consumer complaints related to the misuse of controlled goods or breaches of domestic trade laws were received throughout the operation.

Found floating in Pitas river

18 drums filled with petrol

KUDAT: A total of 18 drums, each with a capacity of 200 litres and filled with petrol, were found floating at the river estuary of Kampung Pagason, Pitas near here by the General Operations Force (PGA) Kudat.

The Kudat branch of the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) received the case handover under the Control of Supplies Act 1961 from Company C, Battalion 16, PGA Kudat.

KPDN District Enforcement Chief Officer Nazatul Shima Karim said the case involved an ownerless seizure (RTT) and

controlled goods exhibits consisting of 3,600 litres of petrol estimated to be worth RM7,164.

She said the immoral activity was carried out in a rather remote area to confuse authorities and conceal smuggling activities from being detected by enforcement agencies.

The department expressed its highest appreciation to the PGA for its strategic cooperation and proactive action in strengthening and ensuring the success of Ops Tiris 4.0 in comprehensively combating any misappropriation of controlled goods in the country.

"At the same time, KPDN remains committed to strengthening enforcement to ensure the supply of controlled goods remains secure and reaches the target groups, especially in facing the challenges of economic uncertainty and the global energy crisis, which place pressure on supply chains and price stability.

"KPDN Kudat Branch also welcomes cooperation from the public in channeling information related to any misappropriation of controlled goods or misconduct by traders through official channels," she said in a statement on Friday.

內貿部擴大昌明關愛促銷 每月4次 覆蓋600州選區

（新山17日讯）国内贸易及生活成本部将持续扩大昌明关爱促销活动（PJRM）的频率，从每月3次增加至4次，覆盖全国600个州选区，其中包括联邦直辖区40个州选区。

国内贸易及生活成本部副部长拿督傅芝雅指出，增加昌明关爱促销活动的频率及扩大覆盖范围，目的是确保更多民众受益，尤其是在国内物价上涨和全球供应危

机等挑战之际，能够以更经济的价格购买生活必需品。

“因此，该部计划将活动频率从每月3次增至4次，覆盖全国600个州选区，包括联邦直辖区的40个州选区。”

傅芝雅昨日前往新山乌达新镇视察昌明关爱促销活动后，昨晚发文告这么指出。

她说，该部正推广关爱促销活动至全国超过3万个地点，从今年1月1日至5月15日，全国共落实1万835个昌明关爱促销系列活动。

“柔佛州政府也是最早相应首相拿督斯里安华号召的州属之一，已经进行1203个系列活动，涉及114万5037笔交易，证明昌明关爱促销活动是一项有效的民生成本干预机制。”

RM300k fuel bill sparks call for subsidy for tourism operators

TAWAU: Sri Tanjong Assemblyman Justin Wong (pic) urged both the Federal and State governments to expedite assistance for tourism operators struggling with rising diesel costs, and to extend subsidy mechanisms to include maritime transport and island tourism.



He said operators are now fully bearing diesel costs without government subsidies.

"I have been informed by an island operator in Semporna that their monthly diesel expenditure has surged to as much as RM300,000 due to the absence of fuel subsidies," he said.

He added that island tourism operators rely on diesel not only for land and sea transport but also to power generators on islands.

According to Justin, the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) had implemented the Subsidised Diesel Con-

trol System policy for land transport vehicles.

"If land transportation receives subsidies, why is maritime transport being sidelined?" he asked.

He said the current subsidised petrol quota of 200 litres per boat it was insufficient for daily operations.

Justin noted that islands such as Semporna and Kota Kinabalu are internationally recognised tourist destinations that receive large numbers of foreign visitors daily.

"As an oil-producing state, continued financial pressure on tourism operators without subsidies will affect one of Sabah's key economic sectors," he said.

He urged the State Government to address the issue seriously to ensure sustainable development of the tourism industry.

He also questioned whether the Sabah government had engaged with the Federal Government on the matter, or was merely remaining passive amid rising global fuel prices caused by conflicts and geopolitical tensions.
