Shopee lancar kempen perkukuh kesedaran scam

KUALA LUMPUR: Shopee Malaysia melancarkan Kempen Jom Beli Selamat bagi memperkukuh kesedaran terhadap penipuan (scam) serta mempromosikan pengalaman membeli-belah dalam talian yang lebih selamat.

Usaha itu dilakukan dengan kerjasama Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) serta Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM).

Menteri KPDN, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata, inisiatif itu merupakan strategi Shopee dalam menggerakkan agenda meningkatkan kesedaran masyarakat mengenai amalan membeli-belah secara selamat dalam talian.

Menurutnya, kempen tersebut memberi penekanan kepada usaha memperkasa pendidikan pengguna melalui penyebaran maklumat berkaitan langkah mengenal pasti taktik penipuan, amalan terbaik urus niaga dalam

talian, saluran membuat aduan serta penggunaan platform yang selamat dan dipercayai.

“Pendekatan ini bertujuan membudayakan amalan pembelian dalam talian yang lebih selamat di samping mengurangkan risiko pengguna menjadi mangsa penipuan.

“Pada masa sama, KPDN menggalakkan penyedia platform e-dagang memperkukuh perlindungan pengguna, meningkatkan patuhan peraturan sedia ada serta memperluas kerjasama dengan agensi penguatkuasaan bagi membanteras penipuan dan salah laku digital.

“Inisiatif ini juga penting untuk memperkasa keyakinan pengguna terhadap ekosistem e-dagang negara.

“Pendekatan ini selaras dengan aspirasi Kerajaan MADANI bagi memperkasa ekonomi domestik, meningkatkan daya

saing PMKS serta memastikan manfaat ekonomi digital dapat dinikmati secara inklusif oleh seluruh rakyat,” katanya pada Majlis Perasmian Sidang Kemuncak Penjual Shopee 2026 dan Kempen Jom Beli Selamat.

Sementara itu, Ketua Hal Ehwal Awam dan Luaran Shopee Malaysia, Nik Emir Nik Mohamed Din berkata, Sidang Kemuncak Penjual Shopee 2026 dengan slogan “Klik Tanpa Risiko” bertujuan mempersiapkan para peniaga untuk menghadapi masa depan, manakala Kempen Jom Beli Selamat bertujuan melindungi masa depan.

“Ketika ekonomi digital Malaysia terus berkembang, para usahawan perlu dilengkapi dengan alat, pengetahuan dan peluang untuk berjaya, sementara pengguna dan perniagaan pula perlu dapat mengambil bahagian dalam ekosistem yang selamat dan dipercayai,” katanya.



KPDN launches 'Jom Beli Selamat' campaign to combat online scams

KUALA LUMPUR: Following the alarming increase in online fraud cases, the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) launched the 'Jom Beli Selamat! Klik Tanpa Risau' campaign to strengthen consumer protection in the digital ecosystem.

Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the joint initiative by Shopee and the Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM) aimed to intensify the consumer education agenda, particularly in cultivating safer online transaction practices and reducing the risk of consumers becoming victims of fraud.

"Platforms like Shopee provide a channel to market, promote and sell goods,

which should be utilised," he said.

"So, it is important for us to work together so that

this ecosystem can help address scam issues, thus ensuring that the people are safer when shopping," he said when speaking at the launch of the 'Jom Beli Selamat' campaign in conjunction with the Shopee Seller Summit 2026 here, yesterday.

Also present were Shopee Malaysia Public & External Affairs head Nik Emir Nik Mohamed Din and Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM) deputy director of Strategic Planning SAC Mohamed Lazim Ismail.

Armizan said losses due to online fraud crimes in the country had exceeded RM4.54 billion for the period 2024 to 2025, involving more than 101,000 cases.

He said a total of 35,368 cases with losses of RM1.57 billion were recorded in 2024, before almost doubling to 66,204 cases with losses of RM2.97 billion in 2025.

For the period January to March this year, he said losses exceeding RM430 million were recorded, showing that the trend is continuing.

Apart from that, he said Shopee and PDRM have also developed an educational microsite that provides practical guidance on common fraud tactics, safe shopping practices, preventive measures as well as access to the National Scam Response Centre (NSRC). — Bernama

KUALA LUMPUR: Susulan peningkatan kes penipuan dalam talian yang semakin membimbangkan, Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) melancarkan kempen 'Jom Beli Selamat!: Klik Tanpa Risau' bagi memperkukuh perlindungan pengguna dalam ekosistem digital.

Beliau berkata, sebanyak 35,368 kes dengan kerugian RM1.57 bilion direkodkan pada 2024, sebelum meningkat hampir dua kali ganda kepada 66,204 kes dengan kerugian RM2.97 bilion pada tahun lalu.

Bagi tempoh Januari hingga Mac tahun ini pula, beliau

berkata, kerugian melebihi RM430 juta direkodkan, menunjukkan trend jenayah itu masih berterusan.

Automatic implementation of BUDI Diesel to curb leakage at border

JOHOR BAHRU: The automatic implementation of BUDI MADANI Diesel (BUDI Diesel) is believed to be able to curb the leakage of diesel subsidies at the country's borders, especially in Sabah and Sarawak which previously received subsidies in bulk.

Deputy Minister of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Datuk Dr Fuziah Salleh said the new approach ensures that only vehicle owners registered in the BUDI Diesel system are eligible to buy subsidised diesel at RM2.10 per litre, thus closing the loophole for subsidy abuse.

She said previously, private diesel vehicle owners had to register their vehicles under the BUDI MADANI programme to qualify them to receive assistance of RM400 per month to cover the cost of purchasing diesel.

"Across the Peninsula, there are approximately 400,000 privately owned vehicles that use diesel, while in Sabah and Sarawak, there are approximately 300,000 registered vehicles. Now, only vehicles registered under the BUDI Diesel system will receive a subsidy at a rate of RM2.10 per litre.

"This will indirectly curb leakage at the country's borders, especially in Sabah and Sarawak because previously it was in bulk and could be purchased by anyone," she said after inspecting the implementation of BUDI Diesel at a petrol station in Bandar Dato' Onn on Thursday.

Also present was Johor Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) director Lilis Saslinda Pornomo.

Fuziah said the automatic implementation would not only curb subsidy leakage but also ensure that assistance was more targeted to groups that truly deserve it without affecting the welfare of the people.

The Ministry of Finance (MOF) in a statement on Tuesday informed about 700,000 private vehicle owners across the country are enjoying subsidised diesel at RM2.10 per litre through the implementation of BUDI Diesel which began on Wednesday.

Failure to display prices: Labuan fun fair operator compounded

LABUAN: A fun fair operator here was compounded for failing to display the prices for several games offered to visitors.

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) Labuan Director Junaidah Arbain said the action followed an inspection by enforcement officers at the entertainment site on the night of July 1 after the Ministry received public complaints.

She said the inspection found the operator had failed to clearly display charges for several games, an offence under the Price Control and Anti-Profiteering (Price Marking for Goods and Charges for Services) Order 2020, made under the Price Control and Anti-Profiteering Act 2011 (Act 723).

"Traders and service providers are required to display prices or charges clearly, prominently and in a manner that is easily understood by consumers before any transaction is made.

"Failure to comply with this require-

ment may affect consumers' ability to make informed choices and cause confusion during service transactions," she said in a statement, Thursday.

Junaidah said individuals convicted of the offence could face a fine of up to RM50,000 or be compounded according to the provisions under the law, while companies could be fined up to RM100,000.

She said KPDN Labuan would continue to intensify monitoring and inspections from time to time to ensure all traders and service providers comply with the laws enforced by the Ministry.

"Firm action will be taken without compromise against any party found violating the regulations," she said.

Junaidah also urged the public to continue channelling information or complaints to KPDN if they detect any breach of trade and consumer-related laws.

She said public cooperation was important in ensuring a more transparent, fair and ethical business environment in Labuan.

阿米占：擬新法應對網購詐騙

海外電商違法須擔責

（吉隆坡2日訊）國內貿易及生活質部將於下周向內閣提交一份全新的法案框架，以加強消費者權益保護，包括應對電子商務交易詐騙案件日益增加的問題。

內貿部長拿督阿米占說，這項法案框架至少包含10項主要政策建議，其中包括引入域外適用條文，讓設於海外的平台也必須為影響馬來西亞消費者的違法行為承擔法律責任。

厘清平台 賣家 買家責任

他指出，新法案也將進一步厘清電子商務生態系統中各方的責任，包括電商平台、賣家及消費者，同時涵蓋企業對企業（B2B）及企業對消費者（B2C）

的交易。

“如果獲得批准，我們將與律政署合作，着手草擬及修訂有關法案。”

阿米占在電商平台蝦皮（Shopee）“安心買，放心購！”（Jom Beli Selamat）活動推介禮上說，最重要的是，一旦發生涉及我國消費者的違法行為，設於海外的平台也必須向馬來西亞執法機構承擔相應責任。

“在這項法案框架中，我們將清楚列明電子商務生態系統各方的責任與義務，包括電商平台、賣家以及消費者。”

“這是內貿部作為負責監管電子商務體系部門所作出的努力。不過，我們不可能單靠一己之力推進這項工作，還需要業界、商家以及消費者本身的共同配合。”

Shopee助提升安全網購意識

這項活動由Shopee聯同馬來西亞皇家警察及內貿部門合作舉辦，作為Shopee推動提升公眾安全網購意識的一項策略。

活動也着重加強消費者教育，通過傳播資訊，協助民眾辨識網絡詐騙手法，了解安全網購的最佳做法、投訴管道，以及如何使用安全可靠的网络購物平台。

這項措施旨在培養更安全的網絡購物文化，同時降低消費者為網絡詐騙受害者的風險。

首季損失4.3億 嚴正看待網詐

另一方面，針對網絡詐騙問題，阿

米占表示，政府正看待網絡詐騙造成的損失金額持續攀升，并在去年大幅增加的情況。

他說，2024年共錄得超過3萬5000宗詐騙案件，涉及損失高達15億7000萬令吉；到了2025年，案件更增至逾6萬宗，損失金額更飆升至29億7000萬令吉，幾乎翻倍。

“單是在今年第一季度，詐騙案件造成的損失已超過4億3000萬令吉。而這只是短短3個月內的數字。”

“因此，保護消費者，尤其是在網絡交易中的消費者，至關重要，以確保人民能够安心購物，並持續對電子商務平台保持信心。”

阿米占表示，政府採取的措施之一，是強化國家詐騙應對中心作為跨部

門協調中心的角色，以便各機構能够迅速采取行动，包括尽力追回詐騙受害者被騙走的款項。

与此同时，他說，內貿部也十分重視消費者保護工作，并根据部门接获的投訴趋势制定应对措施。

他指出，涉及消费者权益保护的投訴，占內貿部2021年接获投訴总数的41.7%；不过，到了2025年，这一比率已下降至18.49%。

“这些投訴主要包括貨物迟未送达，收到的商品品质不符合预期，或实物与电商平台所展示的商品存在差异等问题。”

“这一切都表明，消费者权益保护必须通过教育、执法以及更全面的法律框架持续加强。”

內貿局突檢添油站 商品有標價皆守法

（怡保2日讯）霹州国内贸易及生活成本局打巴分局，将展开添油站检查及执法行动，检查结果显示业者都遵循法规，而且商品都清楚展示价格标示，情况令人满意。

该局在面子书贴文披露，这些日前展开执法行动是确保商业法规获得遵守，并保障消费者权益。

贴文披露，所有受检商店均清楚展示商品价格标示，并使用仍有效及检定期限的秤重设备。

在对禁止向外籍人士出售补贴包装食用油的监察中，执法人员未发现任何违规交易，向商家提供劝导及提醒业者遵守相关规定，也要求在顾客可看见的位置张贴禁止贩售的通告。

至于添油站检查及监察结果显示，未发现业者向外国注册车辆出售RON95汽油的情况。

该局也提醒油站业者遵守有关限制使用国际信用卡及金融卡购买RON95汽油及其他销售规定，包括不可拒绝售卖量额低于20公升的燃油给符合资格消费者。

RUU Persaingan perkara MyCC banteras kartel

Usaha wujud mekanisme penguatkuasaan kekang monopoli dalam talian

Kuala Lumpur: Usaha mewujudkan mekanisme penguatkuasaan bagi membanteras kartel secara dalam talian antara penambahbaikan dicadangkan dalam Rang Undang-Undang (RUU) Persaingan (Pindaan) 2026.

Kegiatan kartel kini didakwa menggunakan algoritma, berkomunikasi dengan ahli menggunakan mesej terpadam sendiri dan teknologi pemadaman digital bagi menghapuskan bukti perbualan kartel.

Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali, berkata pindaan itu penting bagi memastikan Suruhanjaya Persaingan (MyCC) mempunyai keupayaan berdepan perubahan struktur pasaran.

Pindaan itu, katanya turut memberi MyCC kemampuan menyiasat dan menguatkuasakan

Akta Persaingan 2010 (Akta 712) terhadap kes antipersaingan yang semakin kompleks.

Beliau berkata, ia antara lain memberi MyCC keupayaan menangani taktik perusahaan yang semakin kreatif menyembunyikan perlakuan antipersaingan bagi mengelak pengesanan dan tindakan penguatkuasaan.

"Pindaan julung kali Akta 712 ini bertujuan memperkukuh serta menambah baik peruntukan berkaitan tindakan penguatkuasaan terhadap amalan antipersaingan seperti kartel dan mo-

nopoli bermasalah, kuasa serta prosedur penyiasatan dan penguatkuasaan MyCC.

"Selain itu, prosedur pembuat keputusan pada peringkat MyCC serta penambahbaikan terhadap prosedur berkaitan dengan rayuan didengari Tribunal Rayuan Persaingan," katanya ketika membentangkan bacaan kali kedua RUU berkenaan di Dewan Rakyat, semalam.

Berdepan pelbagai cabaran
Dalam pada itu, Armizan yang juga Ahli Parlimen Papar, me-

Dewan Rakyat passes amendments to strengthen Competition Act, expand MyCC powers

KUALA LUMPUR (July 2): Malaysia's Dewan Rakyat has passed amendments to the Competition Act 2010 that expand the law's scope and strengthen the Malaysia Competition Commission's (MyCC) enforcement powers.

Under the Competition (Amendment) Bill 2026, the law will now cover "any economic activity" instead of only "any commercial activity", widening its regulatory reach. The bill was passed by majority voice vote on Thursday.

Other key changes include stronger information-gathering powers for MyCC in investigations and market reviews, a new settlement mechanism for parties admitting liability, and whistleblower protection provisions.

The amendments also update the list of laws exempted from the Competition Act. Previously exempt laws include the Communications and Multimedia Act 1998, Energy Commission Act 2001, and Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia Act 2017. The updated list will also include the Gas Supply Act 1993, Postal Services Act 2012, and Petroleum Regulations 1974.

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said when tabling the bill that the amendments are necessary due to changes in technology and market conditions since the Act came into force in 2010.

He said the revisions aim to improve enforcement against anti-competitive practices such as cartels and monopolies, as well as enhance investigative, decision-making and appeals processes.

An accompanying Competition Commission (Amendment) Bill 2026 was also introduced to align the legal framework governing the commission.

Competition Act amendments to tackle new cartel tactics, bolster MyCC

KUALA LUMPUR: The Competition (Amendment) Bill 2026 proposes to strengthen enforcement against anti-competitive practices following the growing use of technology in cartel activities and the abuse of dominant market positions.

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said that, in line with technological advancements and the emergence of new business models, enterprises engaged in anti-competitive practices had become increasingly sophisticated in their modus operandi.

He said the Bill proposes improvements to provisions governing enforcement action against anti-competitive practices, including cartels and abuses of dominant market positions, while also strengthening the

investigative and enforcement powers and procedures of the Malaysia Competition Commission (MyCC).

"Cartels are now using algorithms, communicating with fellow cartel members through disappearing messages, and employing digital erasure technology to eliminate evidence of their communications," he said when tabling the Bill for its second reading in the Dewan Rakyat on Thursday.

Armizan said the review of the Competition Act 2010 took into account MyCC's 14 years of investigative experience, while also benchmarking its investigation and enforcement procedures against those of other Malaysian agencies, the principles of natural justice, and international best practices.

He said the review found that the Act needed to be strengthened to ensure it remained relevant in addressing evolving market developments.

"The amendments are essential to ensure that MyCC has the capacity to respond to increasingly complex and dynamic market structures, investigate and enforce the Competition Act 2010 against increasingly sophisticated anti-competitive conduct, and address the growing use of creative tactics by enterprises to conceal such practices," he said.

Armizan said the 34-clause Bill also proposes, among other things, to amend Section 24 to create a criminal offence for attempting to destroy, conceal, tamper with or alter records and data with the intent of obstructing a MyCC investigation. — Bernama

Rewards for cartel whistleblowers

WHISTLEBLOWERS who provide information leading to the detection of cartel activities could soon receive rewards under proposed amendments to the Competition Act 2010. Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the Competition (Amendment) Bill 2026 would introduce two new provisions to shield informants' identities and empower the Malaysia Competition Commission (MyCC) to offer financial incentives for actionable information.

他說, 修正案是為了加強打擊價格串謀、市場分配、限制產量及濫用市場支配地位等反競爭行為。

擴大“企業”定義

他說, 這是《2010年競爭法令》實施15年來首次全面修法, 旨在因應數字經濟、商业模式及市場結構不斷變化, 確保競爭法令與時並進。

阿米占指出, 隨著科技發展, 企業已由過去透過實體會議串謀定價, 轉而利用WhatsApp群組、電郵、線上會議、演算法、自動銷毀訊息及數字抹除技術進行串謀, 令執法工作更具挑戰, 因此有必要強化執法工具。

他在總結辯論時說, 修正案也擴大“企業”的定義, 不再僅限於從事商業活動的實體, 而是涵蓋所有從事經濟活動、提供商品或服務的單位, 以符合國際慣例, 包括新加坡及歐洲聯盟的競爭法制度。

和解機制可減罰40%

部長說, 修正案也新增“和解機制”, 允許承認違法責任的企業在最終裁決前與MyCC達成和解, 最高可獲40%的財務罰款減免, 以縮短

調查及訴訟程序。

阿米占強調, 40%的減罰並非自動適用, 而是由MyCC集體決定, 並綜合案件嚴重程度、對公眾影響、企業合作程度、調查資源及持續守法情況等因素作出評估。

“新加坡、英國、印度、香港及紐西蘭等國家和地區, 也設有類似減罰制度, 比率介乎15至50%, 因此我國做法符合國際慣例。”

修正案也建議新增吹哨者保護及獎勵機制, 授權MyCC向提供關鍵資料、協助偵破反競爭行為或促成案件定罪的舉報者發放獎勵, 同時保障舉報人身份。

阿米占解釋, 由於《吹哨者保護法令》主要適用於刑事案件, 而競爭法屬於民事執法, 因此有必要在《競爭法令》中增設專屬條文, 保護舉報人並鼓勵更多人挺身舉報違法行為。

官司可上訴至高庭

此外, 修正案擴大MyCC調查權限, 包括可要求政府機構提供資料, 並將政府以外拒絕提供資料、銷毀、隱藏或篡改調查資料列為刑事罪行, 以提升調查效率。

修正案也賦權MyCC向逾期繳付財務罰款的企業征收遲繳費, 若企業仍拒絕繳付, 高庭可按一般判決利率計算利息。

與此同時, 競爭上訴仲裁庭的裁決未來可進一步上訴至高庭, 但上訴範圍僅限法律問題及罰款金額, 不再維持仲裁庭裁決為最終決定。

MALAYSIAN consumers are increasingly concerned over the recent rise in medical insurance premiums.

Although many insurers notified policyholders that premiums for some medical and health insurance/takaful (Mhit) plans would increase, future repricing is expected to be implemented more gradually, mainly due to rising private healthcare costs. However, the sharp increases have affected many consumers who are already facing stagnant incomes and rising living costs.

Many Malaysians purchased private medical insurance to avoid long waiting times in the public healthcare system and to gain more reliable access to private healthcare. They expected that paying insurance premiums would provide them with affordable and sustainable protection when they needed medical treatment.

However, the increase in premiums has resulted in some consumers discontinuing their policies. It has been reported that between January 2024 and June 2025, more than 340,000 consumers chose to forgo their medical insurance due to substantial premium increases.

The causes of rising medical costs have resulted in different parties pointing fingers at one another. Private hospitals have blamed insurers while insurers have raised concerns over over-treatment and rising hospital charges contributing to higher claims. Ultimately, the greatest impact is felt by consumers.

Medical insurance is a complex product and consumers often depend on agents to recommend suitable plans. Frequently, benefits are emphasised while risks and long-term affordability are less clearly explained. Consumers have little control over premium increases or hospital charges.

The claim of a "buffet syndrome" – where policyholders allegedly over-consume medical services because they are covered by insurance – has been cited as one of the factors contributing to rising healthcare costs. However, this claim requires stronger evidence before consumers are blamed for driving medical inflation.

According to the Health Ministry's White Paper, factors contributing to rising healthcare costs include the increase in non-communicable diseases, emerging and recurring infectious diseases, an ageing population, mental health challenges, advances in healthcare technology, climate change impacts, and rising healthcare workforce costs.

While these are valid contributors to

healthcare inflation, they affect healthcare systems worldwide. Therefore, Malaysia's higher medical inflation compared with regional and global averages requires further examination.

In 2025, Malaysia's medical inflation was reported at 15%, compared with an Asia-Pacific average of 11.1% and a global average of 10%. The Competition Commission, the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry and Health Ministry should investigate why medical inflation in Malaysia is higher than regional and global averages. Even in 2023, Malaysia's medical inflation rate of 12.6% was significantly above the global average of 5.6%.

According to a report by Bank Negara Malaysia, hospital supplies and service charges make up a significant portion of total medical charges for both non-surgical and surgical treatments. As doctors' fees are regulated, other private healthcare charges remain less controlled, creating concerns over transparency and affordability.

The report also highlighted differences in charges between insured patients and those paying directly. For example, some surveys found that insured patients using guarantee letters were charged substantially higher amounts for certain treatments compared with patients who paid upfront.

Fomca fully supports the Prime Minister's proposal to amend the Private Healthcare Facilities and Services Act 1998 (Act 586) to regulate private hospital charges and implement a diagnosis-related group (DRG) payment mechanism.

The DRG system recommends a fixed fee or fee range based on the complexity of a medical procedure, including reasonable charges for scans, hospital supplies, and related services.

Regulated pricing could help reduce private healthcare costs and ease pressure on insurance premiums. While Bank Negara Malaysia has introduced measures including spreading out premium adjustments, temporarily pausing certain repricing exercises and encouraging the development of alternative Mhit products, one of the most significant steps is the introduction of more affordable insurance options.

The base Mhit plan is designed as a more affordable medical protection plan that

balances coverage with sustainability. It has a lower annual limit and standardised benefits aimed at covering common hospital admissions.

One major concern regarding the new plans is mandatory co-payment, which requires policyholders to bear part of the medical bill before insurance coverage applies. This measure is intended to discourage unnecessary healthcare utilisation.

However, the "buffet syndrome" argument should be treated cautiously. A report by the Khazanah Research Institute, "Raising Medical Premiums: Can it be Cured?", noted that there is limited evidence proving widespread abuse of medical insurance in Malaysia.

The greater concern is that co-payment plans, while offering lower premiums, may transfer a greater financial burden to consumers who are already struggling with medical inflation.

There is also a need to move away from the current fee-for-service model towards a value-based healthcare system, where costs are linked to outcomes rather than the number of services provided. The proposed DRG system would support this approach by paying hospitals a fixed amount for a particular treatment instead of encouraging itemised billing.

A properly implemented DRG system could help improve transparency, reduce unnecessary costs, and ensure that patients receive appropriate care.

Another positive aspect of the Mhit plan, according to the Health minister, is that pre-

existing conditions may be covered under the new framework. This is important because many consumers who need medical protection most often face difficulties obtaining insurance.

There is also a need for stronger consumer education. Malaysians must understand that the best insurance policy is not necessarily the one with the most benefits but one that remains affordable and sustainable throughout their lives as premiums rise with age and healthcare costs.

Despite the focus on private insurance, medical insurance is not the largest source of healthcare spending in Malaysia. In 2022, medical insurance accounted for 8.3% of total health expenditure while government spending accounted for 42.9%. Out-of-pocket payments by patients accounted for 37.2%, which remains a major concern.

The measures introduced by the government and Bank Negara Malaysia to address medical inflation should be supported. However, Fomca believes the government must also increase investment in public healthcare, upgrade facilities, modernise healthcare delivery through digitalisation and strategic purchasing and support healthcare workers.

A strong and accessible public healthcare system remains essential to ensure that healthcare in Malaysia remains affordable and available to all.

Registration mismatch leaves Sabah SMEs out of fuel subsidy rollout

KOTA KINABALU: Many businesses in Sabah are being excluded from receiving the Budi Diesel Subsidy scheme due to registration issues linked to the Companies Commission of Malaysia (SSM), despite operating legally under licenses issued by local authorities (PBT), said Likas assemblyman Tham Yun Fook.

He said he has received numerous complaints from since the federal government implemented the mechanism last month, which also imposes a 200-litre monthly cap on subsidised diesel for eligible vehicles.

Tham said while the framework allows company-owned diesel vehicles to apply for subsidised diesel, many legitimate businesses in Sabah are being left out in practice due to system limitations.

"The issue is that many sole proprietorships in Sabah are not registered with the SSM but operate legally under business licences issued by local authorities.

"However, the system appears to be linked only to the SSM database, resulting in these businesses operating and their vehicles not being recognised," he said.

Tham added that in many cases, the business and vehicle owner are the same person, but discrepancies in registration systems have led to their exclusion from the subsidy.

"This situation is clearly unfair to small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) that rely heavily on diesel vehicles.

"Without access to subsidised

diesel, their operating costs increase significantly, placing a financial burden on them," he said.

Tham also highlighted complaints from affected business owners who were directed between government agencies without any clear resolution.

"Some were told by Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) to visit the Road Transport Department (JPJ) to update their registration details, but JPJ referred them back to KPDN.

"This confusion has left many frustrated," he said.

Tham said he had raised the matter with the KPDN Sabah director and was assured it would be addressed, but no system improvements have been made so far.

He urged the Ministry of Finance (MoF) to resolve data integration issues to ensure all eligible businesses benefit from the scheme.

"The government must take into account Sabah's unique geographical conditions, a one-size-fits-all approach is unsuitable," he said.
