49 aduan diterima berkaitan peniaga durian 'licik'

PEKAN – Menggunakan alat timbang dan sukat yang sudah tamat tempoh dan gagal memaparkan tanda harga antara aduan yang diterima Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) daripada orang awam berkaitan peniaga durian sepanjang tahun ini.

Ketua Pengarah Penguat Kuasa KPDN, Datuk Azman Adam berkata, pihaknya mendapati ada segelintir peniaga yang tidak mempedulikan alat timbang yang digunakan hanya kerana merasakan durian merupakan perniagaan bermusim.

Katanya, sepanjang 1 Januari hingga 30 Jun lalu, sebanyak 49 aduan diterima melibatkan peniaga durian yang kebanyakannya berkaitan tiada tanda harga dan alat timbang dan sukat yang tidak ditentusahkan.

"Sebelum berniaga, peniaga perlu periksa alat timbang dan kita ada beberapa syarikat yang diberi kebenaran kerajaan (memeriksa alat timbang) bagi memastikan timbangan tepat supaya boleh digunakan dalam urusan perniagaan.

"Ia merupakan kesalahan dari segi undang-undang di bawah

Seksyen 14 (6) Akta Timbang Sukat sekiranya menggunakan alat timbang tidak ditentusahkan," katanya dalam sidang akhbar sempena Program 'Ride For Patuh' dan Advokasi Kepenggunaan Bersama Komuniti Peringkat Negeri Pahang di Masjid Kampung Padang Rumbia di sini semalam.

Tambahnya, selain melibatkan alat timbang sukat, peniaga yang gagal memaparkan harga jualan juga boleh dikenakan tindakan mengikut Akta Kawalan Harga dan Anti Pencatutan 2011.

"Selain dikenakan kompaun,

pihak kami turut memberikan nasihat dan penerangan kepada peniaga termasuk melalui Program 'Ride For Patuh'.

"Kita bagi peringatan kepada mereka sebab kadang-kadang mereka tidak berniat untuk menipu dan minta mereka buat pemeriksaan segera," katanya.

Mengulas mengenai Program 'Ride For Patuh', beliau berkata program itu menjadi platform bagi mengukuhkan jaringan kerjasama strategik antara KPDN Pahang dengan pemimpin masyarakat, agensi kerajaan, pihak industri dan komuniti setempat.

Kilang sabun disyaki guna logo halal tidak sah diserbu

PETALING JAYA – Sebuah kilang memproses sabun pencuci di sekitar Seri Kembangan diserbu Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) Selangor selepas disyaki menggunakan logo halal yang tidak sah bagi tujuan perdagangan.

Pengarah KPDN Selangor, Muhammad Hanif Asa'ari berkata,

operasi bersepadu itu bermula pukul 11.25 pagi semalam dijalankan dengan kerjasama Bahagian Perisikan dan Operasi Khas, Jabatan Imigresen (JIM) Putrajaya.

Menurutnya, pemeriksaan mendapati kilang berkenaan memasarkan produk sabun pencuci secara dalam talian dan dipercayai menggunakan logo

halal yang tidak diperakui pihak berkuasa.

"Hasil pemeriksaan, KPDN Selangor menyita sebanyak 31,140 unit sabun pencuci, 40,000 unit plastik pembungkusan serta beberapa dokumen yang disyaki menggunakan logo halal yang tidak sah.

"Nilai rampasan keseluruhan dianggarkan berjumlah

RM215,700," katanya dalam kenyataan semalam.

Beliau berkata, seramai lima pekerja warga asing dan seorang pengarah syarikat warga tempatan turut diperiksa bagi membantu siasatan.

"Kelima-lima pekerja warga asing itu telah diserahkan kepada pihak JIM untuk tindakan lanjut," ujarnya.

Mengulas lanjut, Hanif berkata, operasi bersepadu itu dijalankan susulan maklumat awam berhubung penyalahgunaan logo halal pada produk yang dibungkus syarikat terbabit.

Katanya, kes disiasat di bawah subperenggan 8(b), Perintah Perihal Dagangan (Perakuan dan Penandaan Halal) 2011, Akta Perihal Dagangan 2011.

RM38.36m seized in Ops Tiris 4.0

PEKAN: Ops Tiris 4.0 (Integrated) recorded 983 cases of diversion and smuggling of subsidised controlled goods nationwide, with a total seizure value of RM38.36 million, from March 16 until Wednesday.

Pahang Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) director-general Datuk Azman Adam said the success demonstrates the government's efforts to curb the leakage of controlled and subsidised goods in the context of geopolitical uncertainty, including conflicts in West Asia that put pressure on oil and commodity prices.

He said the success of the operation was not only due to the actions of the KPDN enforcement officers, but also driven by the close cooperation of the public, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), and various enforcement agencies that provided information to the ministry.

"Via this operation, we managed to save our goods from being smuggled out. Six items that are often smuggled out are petrol, diesel, liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), cooking oil, wheat flour and sugar," he said. – Bernama

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哈尼占检查制造清洁肥皂的化学原料成份。(KPDN提供)

肥皂廠涉濫用清真標誌 內貿局充公值21萬物品

(沙亚南9日讯) 国内贸易及生活费部雪州分局日前突击检查史里肯邦安一家清洁肥皂加工厂，揭发该工厂涉嫌在产品包装上，使用未经认可的清真(Halal)标志，共起获逾3万1000件清洁肥皂及4万个包装袋，充公物品总值约21万5700令吉。

该局主任莫哈末哈尼夫昨晚发文告指出，当局于昨日(8日)上午11时25分，由雪州执法主任莫哈末哈尼占亲自率队，联同内贸部情报及特别行动组、以及移民局布城总部展开联合执法行动，突击检查上述工厂。

他说，该工厂主要通过网络销售清洁肥皂产品。执法人员检查时发现，厂方涉嫌将未经当局认证的清真标志用于商品包装，作为商业用途。

现场盘查5员工1董事

执法人员在行动中充公3万1140件清洁肥皂、4万个塑料包装袋，以及多份涉嫌使用未经认证清真标志的文件，估计总值约21万5700令吉。

此外，当局也当场盘查5名外籍员工及1名本地公司董事，以协助调查。其中，5名外劳随后被移交移民局，作进一步跟进调查。

哈尼夫表示，此次行动是根据公众情报展开。当局援引《2011年商品说明法令》下的《商品说明(清真认证及标志)指令》第8(b)条文开档调查。

一旦罪成，公司可被罚款不超过20万令吉；重犯者最高可罚款50万令吉。个人则可能被罚款不超过10万令吉、或监禁不超过3年，或两者兼施；重犯者最高可罚款25万令吉、或监禁不超过5年，或两者兼施。

他强调，当局绝不姑息任何滥用清真标志的行为，并将持续加强执法，以保障消费者权益及维护我国清真认证制度的公信力。

Better copyright protections in store

Artists' resale rights a key point in proposed reforms

PETALING JAYA: A wide range of amendments to the Copyright Act 1987 are being considered to enhance Malaysia's copyright framework for the digital age.

The Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO) said this will include proposals on artificial intelligence (AI), online piracy, orphan works, artists' resale rights and copyright dispute resolution.

Among key proposals is to introduce a legal framework governing the use of copyrighted works by AI, with an emphasis on transparency, fairness and appropriate compensation, according to a public consultation document released by MyIPO.

"Creators, publishers and media want to be asked first, paid fairly and told clearly how their works are being used."

"Malaysia is considering a framework that balances protecting creators with supporting AI innovation," said MyIPO, a body under the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN).

To strengthen efforts against online piracy, MyIPO is proposing the introduction of dynamic injunctions, allowing courts to block entire networks of pirate websites under a single court order.

Under the proposal, once the initial order is granted, newly identified infringing websites can be added without requiring a fresh lawsuit each time.

MyIPO said reforms will also be considered by the Copyright Tribunal.

"Under the current Act, the Copyright Tribunal can hear royalty disputes only if both the licensing body and its member consent, allowing either party to prevent a case from proceeding."

"Under the proposed amendments, either the licensing body or its member may refer a dispute to the tribunal without requiring the other party's consent."

"All cases will be resolved within 60 days after the conclusion of hearings," MyIPO added.

Additionally, there is also a proposed legal framework to the Act, which is orphan works.

Orphan works are copyrighted materials such as books, newspapers, photographs and films whose owners cannot be identified or located.

The proposed amendment by MyIPO suggests that if someone does a diligent search but still cannot find the owner, there should be a legal framework allowing the work to be used for things like education, research, preservation or public interest projects.

"Libraries and universities can digitise older works, providing

researchers and educators with access to historical resources, enriching public cultural knowledge and supporting the creative economy through new material for documentaries, exhibitions and innovation," MyIPO said.

Another proposed amendment is the introduction of the Artist's Resale Right (ARR), which will allow artists to receive royalties when their artworks are resold.

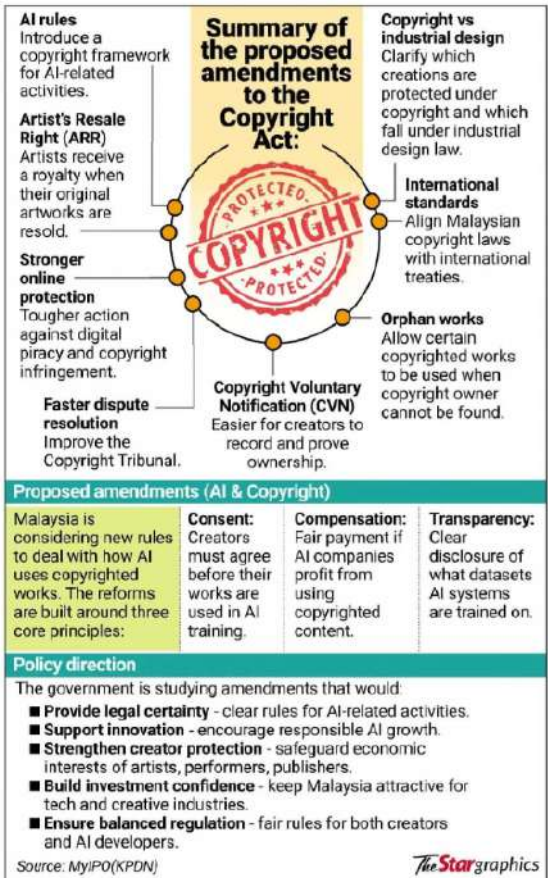
Malaysia currently has no law recognising ARR, meaning artists do not receive a share of any increase in the value of their works after the initial sale.

"The proposed Artist Resale Right aims to strengthen creative industries, promote fairness, support GDP contribution, and sustain creativity," MyIPO said, adding that over 90 countries had implemented similar schemes.

"Eligible works under the resale right would include fine art, photography, illustrations, crafts, designs, architecture and prints," MyIPO said.

The proposed amendments also seek to provide clearer distinctions between copyright protection for creative works, such as paintings, drawings and digital art, and industrial design protection for products manufactured through industrial processes.

"This helps KPDN quickly decide the right type of protection for products in the market and ensure



more consistent enforcement.

"This will also reduce unnecessary disputes and improve coordination between the copyright and industrial design protection systems," it said.

According to MyIPO, the pro-

posed changes are aimed at improving access to justice, enhancing legal certainty and enabling faster resolutions by providing stakeholders a credible forum to resolve copyright disputes without lengthy delays.

Cadangan tambah baik Budi Diesel ke Kabinet Negeri

KOTA KINABALU: Kerajaan Sabah akan mendapatkan sokongan Kabinet Negeri terhadap cadangan penambahbaikan Program Subsidi Diesel Budi Madani (Budi Diesel) susulan dapatan bahawa mekanisme ketika ini belum memenuhi keperluan sebenar masyarakat luar bandar di negeri ini.

Menteri Pertanian, Perikanan dan Industri Makanan Sabah, Datuk Jamawi Jaafar, berkata kementeriannya telah mengadakan sesi libat urus bersama agensi Persekutuan, termasuk Kementerian Kewangan (MOF) dan Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN), bagi membentangkan isu yang dihadapi petani, pengusaha industri makanan serta pengusaha pengangkutan luar bandar.

Beliau berkata, hasil sesi libat urus itu akan dibentangkan kepada Kabinet Negeri pada 13 Sept bagi mendapatkan sokongan kerajaan negeri sebelum dikeseluruhan secara rasmi kepada kerajaan Persekutuan.

"Isu yang kita bangkitkan adalah berdasarkan realiti yang berlaku di luar bandar Sabah. Kita mahu Kerajaan Persekutuan memahami keadaan sebenar di lapangan sebelum mempertim-

bangkan penambahbaikan terhadap tadbir urus dan pelaksanaan program Budi Diesel," katanya kepada pemberita selepas majlis menandatangani memorandum persefahaman (MoU), pada Khamis.

Jamawi berkata, sesi dialog yang turut dihadiri Ketua Setiausaha Perbendaharaan, Datuk Johan Mahmood Merican, serta pegawai kanan Persekutuan itu memberi ruang kepada Sabah mengemukakan isu yang berbeza daripada situasi di Semenanjung Malaysia.

Katanya, antara perkara utama yang dibangkitkan ialah nasib pengusaha pengangkutan sekolah di luar bandar yang tidak layak menerima subsidi diesel walaupun menyediakan perkhidmatan penting kepada pelajar.

"Tidak seperti di Semenanjung Malaysia, kebanyakan daerah di Sabah tidak menggunakan bas sekolah kuning konvensional. Murid dihantar ke sekolah menggunakan pelbagai jenis kenderaan yang mungkin tidak layak menerima subsidi diesel, sedangkan perkhidmatan itu amat penting bagi memastikan mereka dapat hadir ke sekolah," katanya.

Beliau berkata, kementerian turut membangkitkan kesan peningkatan kos

diesel terhadap pemain industri makanan dan pengusaha sektor pertanian, khususnya yang beroperasi di kawasan pedalaman, yang sememangnya berdepan kos pengangkutan lebih tinggi.

Jamawi berkata, beliau telah memperolehi persetujuan Ketua Menteri Datuk Seri Hajiji Noor, sebelum mengadakan sesi libat urus yang menghimpunkan ketua jabatan serta agensi di bawah Kementerian Pertanian, Perikanan dan Industri Makanan Sabah (Maffi) serta Kementerian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan yang beroperasi di Sabah.

"Kita telah menyampaikan sendiri pengalaman dan masalah yang dihadapi rakyat Sabah. Cadangan yang dikumpulkan akan dibawa ke Kabinet Negeri supaya kerajaan negeri dapat menyokong isu serta syor yang dikeseluruhan kementerian," katanya.

Beliau berharap sesi libat urus itu akan membawa kepada penambahbaikan tadbir urus dan mekanisme pelaksanaan program Budi Diesel supaya lebih mengambil kira cabaran logistik dan pengangkutan yang unik di Sabah, terutama di kawasan luar bandar yang masih bergantung kepada pengangkutan berkuasa diesel. – Samantha Sulit

KUALA LUMPUR (July 9): The government expects construction material prices and supply to remain stable after fuel prices moderated following tempered tensions in West Asia.

Based on weekly monitoring, increases in prices of the seven main construction materials peaked in March and April at 13.3%, Works Minister Datuk Seri Alexander Nanta Linggi said, but he noted that there has been no sharp increase overall.

"In view of the latest developments in diesel prices, it is expected that the prices and supply of construction materials will remain stable," Alexander said in a written parliamentary reply on Wednesday.

Looking at retail cement and diesel prices, data for which the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living began collecting data in May 2026, prices are heavily influenced by retail diesel prices in each state.

Up to June, no cement supply shortage was reported, while the highest retail cement price reached RM28 per bag in Labuan and Sarawak. Wholesale cement price remained at RM24 per bag.

The minister was responding to a question from Hulu Selangor MP Mohd Hasnizan Harun on the government's contingency plans to ensure road main-

tenance and critical infrastructure projects remained unaffected by uncertainty over diesel prices and logistics costs arising from the West Asia conflict.

Overall construction costs up 5-10%

In a separate written parliamentary reply, Alexander noted that overall construction costs have risen by 5% to 10% on elevated fuel prices due to the West Asia conflict.

"For the national construction sector, the increase in fuel costs, particularly diesel, has resulted in significant increases in

factory production costs, material processing costs and the logistics costs of transporting construction materials to project sites," he said.

One of the main implications, he noted, is an estimated 5% to 10% increase in overall cost of construction projects compared with their original contract cost estimates.

"To address these risks, the Ministry of Works, together with the Public Works Department and Construction Industry Development Board, continuously carries out close monitoring and effective on-site project supervision to reduce the burden on contractors," he said.

Alexander was responding to Saratok Member of Parliament Datuk Ali Biju's queries on the impact of increased global construction material costs on the original allocation ceiling for federal government projects in Sarawak under the 12th Malaysia Plan (12MP), and whether the government will approve additional allocations to prevent the affected projects from being abandoned.

The minister said the government is deeply concerned about the continued implementation of public infrastructure projects, particularly those under the 12MP, but noted that projects remain subject to existing allocation ceilings.



黄勤如率团拜访纳闽贸消局 交流柴油补贴及生活成本课题

(本报纳闽9日讯) 纳闽中华商会会长拿督黄勤如日前率领理事代表，礼貌拜访马来西亚国内贸易及生活费部纳闽分局总监祖奈达，并就近期柴油补贴政策、商界关注课题及降低生活成本等议题展开交流与讨论。

在会上，双方重点针对柴油补贴政策交换意见。其中，商会提出部分同款车型却未能获得相同柴油补贴资格的问题。对此，祖奈达解释，柴油补贴的审核标准并非单纯依据车辆型号，而是以车辆的实际用途及性质作为主要考量。

柴油补贴政策涉及多个政府部门的协调与审核，并非仅由国内贸易及生活费部负责，当中还包括纳闽陆路交通局、马来西亚公司委员会等相关机构，因此补贴资格需依据各项规定综合评估。

纳闽中华商会也反映，目前仍有部分行业，包括种植业、食品业、建筑业及其他相关领域，尚未享有柴油补贴，业者仍需按照市场价格购买柴油，

增加经营成本。

针对上述课题，祖奈达表示，相关行业代表早前已向该部总部提出有关诉求，目前有关议题仍在研究及处理阶段。

同时，她鼓励符合资格的企业和业者积极提出柴油补贴申请，以便相关部门进行审核。

她进一步说明，国内贸易及生活费部所负责的是商业用途柴油补贴计划，并非个人用途柴油补贴，因此申请资格主要依据企业营运性质及政府现行政策。
