CM orders meet over diesel

PETALING JAYA:

The Sabah government is engaging the Finance Ministry and relevant federal agencies over the implementation of the targeted diesel subsidy programme, which took effect in the state this month, said Chief Minister Datuk Seri Hajiji Noor (pic).

He said that following concerns raised by various stakeholders, a follow-up meeting with the Finance Ministry and State and Federal agencies would be held this Friday, to be chaired by the Sabah State Secretary.

"The expansion of the targeted diesel subsidy programme to Sabah, which began on July 1, was also discussed at a state Cabinet meeting on July 13. In this regard, the Finance Ministry and relevant government agencies have been instructed to examine the issues further and consider appropriate recommendations to address the concerns of those affected," he said.

Putrajaya introduced the BUDI Diesel programme on July 1, under which eligible diesel vehicle owners throughout the country are entitled to 200 litres of subsidised diesel at RM2.10 a litre.

Earlier, Finance Minister II Amir Hamzah Azizan said Putrajaya was prepared to review diesel subsidy quotas in rural Sabah, particularly for residents who rely on diesel-powered vehicles as their main mode of transport.

He said while the government was open to improving the implementation of targeted diesel subsidies, any new mechanism must be applied in close cooperation with the State Government.

Amir's remarks followed calls by Sabah DAP chairman Phoong Jin Zhe for the gov-

ernment to review the state's monthly BUDI Diesel quota. Phoong had said that 200 litres was insufficient for many households.

State Agriculture, Fisheries and Food Industry Minister Datuk Jamawi Jaafar said he presented a comprehensive report on how our farmers have been affected, how farm machinery has been impacted, how pickup truck owners have been affected as well as young people who rely on pickup trucks and jeeps for work and business.

"The Chief Minister took the matter seriously and instructed the State Cabinet to invite the Ministry of Finance and KPDN to conduct briefing and engagement sessions with civil servants and government elected representatives," he said.

Jamawi said the first session will be held on Friday at Menara Kinabalu with heads of state departments, while a second session involving government assemblymen will take place on Sunday.

He said the meetings are intended to give the federal government a clearer understanding of the realities on the ground since the BUDI Diesel scheme came into effect.

According to Jamawi, Sabah's geography and long travel distances result in fuel consumption patterns that differ significantly from those in Peninsular Malaysia, requiring a more tailored approach to subsidy implementation.

"We are not the same as Peninsular Malaysia. Over there, a three-hour drive can take you across several states. In Sabah, you can drive for three hours and still not even reach the next district. That is why diesel and petrol usage in Sabah is different.

"We understand that subsidy leakages must be addressed, but the burden should not be shifted onto farmers, fishermen, food industry operators and young entrepreneurs simply because the authorities failed to curb leakages. That would not be fair to them," he said in Ranau.

RM19.96m illegal goods seized

KUCHING: The General Operations Force (GOF) Sarawak Brigade recorded 18 successful operations over the past two weeks, seizing unlicensed frozen products, subsidised diesel, and various illegal timber and wildlife-related products worth RM19.96 million.

The operations, carried out across the State from July 1 until yesterday (July 13), involved Op Taring Bravo, Op Taring Chiller, Op Taring Batas/Awas, Op Taring Libas, and Op Bersepadu Khazanah.

In a news reported by TVS, Sarawak GOF Commander SAC Lim Bak Phai said the operations also resulted in several arrests involving locals and foreigners.

He said the achievements reflected the force's continuous efforts in combating smuggling activities, cross-border crimes, and various violations of the law.

Among the biggest seizures were more than 60 tonnes of frozen products without permits, including chicken, pork, fish, nuggets, and sausages, uncovered in Sibul, Miri, Bintulu, Sri Aman and Kuching.

"Also seized were cold storage facilities, vehicles, and processing equipment with a total value of RM10.06 million.

"In separate operations, the GOF also crippled activities involving the misuse of subsidised diesel in Sri Aman and Kota Samarahan, with seizures of nearly 16,000 litres of diesel, skid tanks, storage tanks, heavy machinery, and other equipment worth RM824,599," he said in a statement.

Lim said Op Taring Libas and Op Bersepadu Khazanah also uncovered illegal logging, unauthorised timber processing, and wildlife-related offences.

The seizures included logs, processed timber, agarwood, swiftlet nests, heavy machinery, and storage facilities.

Meanwhile, Op Taring Batas/Awas saw several undocumented migrants detained and smuggling attempts involving rice and frozen meat products without permits foiled, with mobile phones, motorcycles, and cash worth RM783,747.40 seized.

"All arrests and seized items have been handed over to relevant agencies, including the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN), Sarawak Veterinary Services Department (DVSS), Forest Department Sarawak (FDS), Sarawak Timber Industry Development Corporation

(STIDC), Sarawak Forestry Corporation (SFC), Malaysia Immigration Department, Sarawak Paddy and Rice Regulatory Department, and district police headquarters for further action," he said.

Lim added that the GOF would continue intensifying enforcement operations to curb smuggling, misuse of controlled goods, illegal logging, wildlife offences, and cross-border crimes to safeguard the State's security. - DayakDaily



斗湖两商店未标售价遭内贸部开罚

(斗湖 15 日讯) 国内贸易及生活成本部 (KPDN) 斗湖分局近期在加拉巴干乡区开展执法检查, 发现两家商店未依法展示商品售价, 当场对其开出罚单。

沙巴 KPDN 发文告表示, 此次行动旨在规范商业经营, 督促商家遵守法规, 维护市场秩序与消费者合法权益。涉事商店因未按规定标注商品现金售价, 违反《2020 年价格管制与反暴利 (商品价格及服务收费标示) 条例》——该条例依据《2011 年价格管制与反暴利法令》(第 723 号法令) 制定。

当局强调, 所有对外销售商品, 尤其食用油、白糖等统制必需品, 均须清晰醒目标示售价, 保障交易透明, 方便消费者比价。本次行动中, 执法人员同时向受检商户发出 15 份《商店检查声明》, 留存检查记录以便后续监督。

KPDN 指出, 将持续加大市场巡查与执法力度, 尤其在佳节前夕强化监管, 督促商家合规经营。根据相关法令, 个人初犯最高罚款 5 万令吉、监禁 2 年或两者并罚; 重犯最高罚款 10 万令吉、监禁 3 年或两者并罚。公司初犯最高罚 10 万令吉, 再犯最高罚 25 万令吉。

'Fuel subsidy system queries underway to meet Sabah's realities'

RANAU: Improvements to the implementation of the Budi Diesel subsidy mechanism in Sabah are expected within the next two or three weeks following ongoing engagement sessions between the state government and relevant federal ministries.

Agriculture, Fisheries and Food Industry Minister Datuk Jamawi Jaafar said the matter was raised during the State Cabinet meeting after his ministry presented findings from the recent discussions with the Ministry of Finance (MoF) and the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) on the impact of the targeted diesel subsidy programme in Sabah.

He said the report highlighted the challenges faced by farmers, agricultural machinery operators, pick-up truck owners and young entrepreneurs who rely on diesel-powered vehicles for work and business activities.

The Chief Minister has taken this matter very seriously and instructed the state Cabinet to invite the MoF and KPDN to conduct briefing with civil servants and government elected representatives," he told reporters after officiating the Pasture Handover Ceremony, Kitchen Garden Launch and Pet Vaccination Campaign at the Ranau Department of

Veterinary Services Office here on Wednesday.

According to Jamawi, the first discussion involving heads of state departments would be held tomorrow (July 17) at Menara Kinabalu, followed by a session with government elected representatives on Sunday.

The meeting would allow the federal government to better understand the situation

on the ground following the implementation of the Budi Diesel framework.

Jamawi said Sabah requires a different approach compared to Peninsular Malaysia due to its vast geographical landscape and long travel distances.

"Our situation is not the same as that in Peninsular Malaysia.

"There, a three-hour drive can take you across several states,

whereas in Sabah, even after driving for three hours, you may not have reached the next district.

"That is why diesel and petrol consumption requirements in Sabah are different.

During the event, his ministry provided aid to two pasture areas in Ranau, including fencing posts, fencing wire, livestock feed and grass-processing machines

to produce higher-quality animal feed.

He also revealed that the Kitchen Garden initiative had received strong response, with more than 3,000 individuals and groups across Sabah now participating in the outreach.

The ministry had initially targeted 5,000 Kitchen Garden operators within five years, but the current progress indicates that the target could be achieved earlier.

"We initially expected to recruit 1,000 new operators each year, but judging by the enthusiasm shown by the people of Sabah today, I am truly grateful for the strong support given to the ministry's initiatives, he said.

Jamawi said the ministry is developing a digital platform known as kebundapur.com, which is expected to be launched within the next one to two months to help operators market agricultural, fisheries and livestock products directly to consumers.

He said the platform will not require a special licence, but all products would be monitored by the relevant agencies to ensure compliance with quality and food safety standards.

Also present were Paginatan assemblyman Datuk Rusdin Riman, Permanent Secretary to the Ministry, Datuk Jumain Abdul Ghani and Sabah Director of Veterinary Services, Dr Zul Bahar Abdul Rashid.

Miri townhall to clarify SKDS for businesses, public

MIRI: A townhall session will be held here on July 19 to help residents and business owners better understand the implementation of the Subsidised Diesel Control System (SKDS) and the Budi Madani diesel subsidy programme, said Miri MP Chiew Choon Man.

The session, scheduled for 2pm at the Pei Min Middle School auditorium, aims to provide the public with a platform to seek clarification directly from the relevant authorities on matters related to the diesel subsidy mechanism.

Chiew, also Deputy Tourism, Arts and Culture Minister, said the initiative was organised following numerous enquiries and concerns received by his Miri

Service Centre since the subsidy mechanism came into effect on July 1.

"While it is a principled move to ensure that there are no leakages of subsidised fuel and for there to be targeted subsidies, I deeply understand the people's concerns and worries," he said in a statement.

"My goal is to ensure that every resident and business owner thoroughly understands the mechanism so that this transition can be as smooth as possible, with minimal impact on livelihoods."

Chiew said representatives from the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) Miri branch will be present to explain the application process

for the SKDS Fleet Card for businesses.

Meanwhile, officers from the Inland Revenue Board (IRB) will set up information counters to assist with diesel subsidy eligibility, applications for the additional 100 litres of subsidised diesel for eligible pickup truck owners, and vehicle ownership transfer applications.

"I strongly encourage all Miri residents who wish to gain a comprehensive understanding of the diesel subsidy to attend this session," he said.

"This townhall will not only serve as an information and clarification session, but also as a platform for me to hear directly from the people on the real issues faced on the ground."
